## **Required Courses**

All students are required to take the following courses:

- Mathematics (year-long everyday)
- English/Language Arts (year-long everyday)
- Social Studies (year-long everyday)
- Science (year-long everyday)
- Physical Education (year-long, every other day)
- Communications (year-long, every other day)

## **Elective Courses**

In addition to the above coursework and as a student's schedule allows, Elective Courses are offered and designed to introduce students to subjects across a broad range of educational programming. All Elective Courses meet every-otherday; however, some are year-long while others are one trimester in length. Students are asked to prioritize their elective requests as individual student schedules might not always be able to accommodate certain elective choices. *Please note that the year-long electives, World Language (Spanish, French, and Chinese) and Music (Band or Choir), are a year-long commitment and future schedule change requests to drop or add these courses will not be available.* 

## **Art Education**

All Art electives listed below are new courses designed for anyone interested in Art Education. No previous Art courses are required and all projects will be DIFFERENT from the current school year. Art projects will give students the opportunity to experience a variety of mediums (materials) through hands-on activities to create a variety of artwork. We will learn how the elements and principles of design are used in the creation of art. We will learn about the historical, cultural and social contexts of art. Techniques and terminology are also imbedded in each lesson to provide a well-rounded foundation for the visual arts.

#### Drawing and Beyond

Learn to use your imagination to express yourself. This class will use a variety of art materials and techniques to create original works of art. Projects will focus on 2-dimensional creations, including: Pencils, pastels, charcoal, markers, printmaking and digital design.

#### **Cool Creations**

(Emphasis on, but not limited to clay):

Create fun and functional clay projects using coil, slab and pinch techniques. Projects may also include assemblage, metal foil embossing and collage as well as drawing or digital design.

## Painting, Pencils & More

(Focus on 2-dimensional creations): Create awesome 2-dimensional projects using a variety of materials including: watercolor, watercolor pencils, tempera and digital design. Projects may also include some 3-dimensional works of art with clay or other medium.

## Family and Consumer Science (FACS)

All Family and Consumer Science electives listed below are new courses designed for anyone interested in FACS. No previous FACS courses are required and all recipes and projects will be DIFFERENT from the current school year.

## **Creative Cooking and Design**

Students will use the VEX Robotics to design, build and program real-world objects including a robotic car.

## **Engineering & Design**

Grades 7/8 Explore the principles of engineering while building hands on projects. Learn how structures (towers, bridges, and houses) are designed and constructed. Students will use a variety of tools and machines to create products, which may include; scale bridges, towers, jewelry boxes, lamps, or other construction related items. Students will also use Computer Aided Design software such as Google Sketchup to design, model and test their structures.

## **Innovation, Invention & Graphic Design** Grades 7/8

An in-depth experience inventing new and exciting items. Students will use a variety of materials and resources to apply the principles of physics in designing their inventions and or products. Students will design and build a product, which may include a mechanical pinball machine, catapult, or other devices. Students will also solve design challenges using digital photography and graphics design software and hardware.

games, performances and Chinese handicrafts. Let the Chinese fun begin by registering now! The Chinese curriculum at RMS parallels the high school Chinese curriculum (levels I & II). If you start from 7th grade and continue learning to high school, you will have a chance to finish the College in School program from U of M with college credits at 11th grade or 12th grade.

#### **Chinese B**

#### Grades 8

#### Year-long Course

This course is only open to students who successfully completed Chinese A. An intensive review of Chinese A paves the way for new vocabulary, grammar, and cultural information. Students will build upon the skills learned in Chinese A by listening, speaking, reading, and writing Chinese. Topics studied include: calendar, time, daily routines, the classroom, food, etc.

#### Chinese C

This course is only open to students who successfully completed Chinese B. Students who successfully complete Chinese C will be well prepared to continue Chinese at a more advanced level their freshman year in High School. In this class students will build upon their Chinese language skills through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Topics studied include: geography, weather, clothing, hobbies, and describing people. In addition, they will deepen their understanding of Chinese culture through songs, videos, games, and stories.

#### French A

#### Grade 7

Bonjour! Are you interested in an international business language spoken in over 50 countries on five continents? If so, French is for you! Students will learn introductions, family culture, school schedules and classes, free time activities and verb conjugations in the present tense. With the use of the textbook and videos, you will meet people from France, Switzerland, Belgium, Canada and many African French-speaking countries. Discover French! About 30% of all English words can be traced to French, so learning French will improve your English-language skills. French connects you to the history of the United States and the thousands of places whose names are derived from French. Are you college bound? If so, don't miss your chance to earn College in the Schools (CIS) credit while still in high school. Only students who successfully complete French A and French B in the middle school will have this opportunity.

#### French B

#### Grade 8

#### Year-long Course

This course is open to students who have successfully completed French A. Students will continue to work on speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills by foods, sports, making plans, learning about shopping, clothing, and getting around town. They will continue sentence constructions and irregular verb conjugations in the present tense. There are over 20 million French speakers nearby - Canada, the Caribbean, South America, and even closer to home, in Louisiana, and New England. French opens doors in Canada, the top trading partner of the United States. You will realize that learning another language expands your horizons, develops your intellect, and prepares you to experience the rich and engaging world in which we live. Students who successfully complete this class will be eligible to register for Level 2 French in high school and work toward earning College in the Schools (CIS) credit in high school. ## Year-long Course Do you speak Spanish at home? Have you noticed that you can do more than what our Spanish 1 class offers? Would you like to improve your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills in Spanish? This class is for you! The course will focus on

improving literacy and proficiency with an emphasis on Hispanic culture, identity, community and history. ¿Hablas español con tu familia? ¿Has notado que puedes hacer más de lo que la clase de español 1 te ofrece? ¿Te gustaría leer, escribir, escuchar y hablar mejor en español? In this class students will use district curriculum (Auténtico) to learn the 5 components of language study: listening, speaking, reading, writing, and culture. Topics will include introductions, school life including telling time, schedules and classes; weather, likes/dislikes, activities, descriptions of self and others; and a food vocabulary unit. Students will be forming complete sentences in Spanish. Are you college bound? If so, don't miss your chance to earn College in the Schools (CIS) credit while still in high school. Only students who successfully complete Spanish A and Spanish B in middle school will have this opportunity.

#### Spanish B

#### Grade 8

#### Year-long Course

El español continúa.... This class is offered to 8th grade students who have successfully completed Spanish A. Students will continue to use district curriculum (Auténtico) to work on reading, writing, speaking and listening skills by studying topics that describe food vocabulary, maintaining a healthy lifestyle, leisure activities, making plans, attending parties, going to restaurants, and describing their homes and family. They will continue sentence constructions and irregular verb conjugations in the present tense. Students who successfully complete this class will be eligible to register for Spanish 2 in high school and work toward earning College in the Schools (CIS) credit in high school.
