FROM THE PASTOR

On the eve of the Epiphany of the Lord, we were privileged to have Father Chet Artysiewicz, Past President of Glenmary Home Missioners concelebrate the 4pm Saturday Mass. Fr. Chet, a native of Wilmington from St. Elizabeth Parish was visiting family over Christmas vacation. After serving as president, he volunteered to become the administrator of a mission parish, Holy Trinity, in Williamston, North Carolina. Along with the other 42 member community of priests and brothers, he serves the rural poor in Appalachia and the deep south.

Even though his headquarters is in Cincinnati, Ohio, he remains a Phillies and Eagles fan through and through. The Glenmary Home Missioners do great work in serving the rural poor, establishing missions, and sharing the Good News of the Gospel by deeds as well as words.

Fr. Chet entered the community 60 years ago and is still going strong. As I mentioned in my homily, he is a true missionary, self- sufficient, with a positive attitude, shining the light of Christ to seekers who have never heard the Good News. Like the Magi, he and his community members follow the Star and lead others to Christ. Founded in 1938, by Fr. William Howard Bishop, a priest of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, this rural pastor of 20 years felt strongly that that the rural poor should know Christ and be helped in their poverty by other Christians. Glenmary has founded 120 missions that have become parishes among the 1 % of Catholics, and 80 % unaffiliated who live in the many areas they served.

While Fr Chet was only passing through and not making a mission appeal, he did thank The St. Ann students who supported Glenmary this year with mission donations from their no uniform days. The contribution envelopes that I put out were taken quickly after Mass. There are now others available for the taking. The St. Ann "APP": Associate Pastor's Perspective - I met Monsignor Cini only once in my life.

I was making a retreat at the same location where he was residing after he left St. Ann's as pastor. I was a relatively new seminarian at the time, and so I introduced myself to him at dinner. He invited me to join him at table.

We stayed and talked for quite a while that evening, long after even the dessert dishes had been cleared. I found him to be engaging, quite witty and, perhaps most meaningful to me at the time, sincerely interested in my vocation. He cared about what I was studying at seminary in Baltimore, and shared so many of his thoughts about what makes a good and holy diocesan priest. I knew he wanted me to be one of those priests. That has stayed me with all these years later.

When news came the first week of January that Monsignor passed away, my mind and heart immediately went to that moment at the dining room table where he shared his hopes for the future of the Church of Wilmington. "Don't live your priesthood half-heartedly or only for yourself," he told me then. I do hope I am making him proud.

I know, too, that many of you have very fond memories of your encounters with Monsignor here at St. Ann. One parishioner shared with me the other day how Monsignor was responsible for bringing her and her husband back to the Church; another was good enough to tell me how her non-practicing husband found his homilies to be intellectually stimulating and challenging, and so he kept coming to Mass just for that opportunity. And apparently, so many of you remember his Lenten soup and Scripture sessions, which just goes to show that Jesus knew *exactly* what he was doing when he kept feeding the hungry crowds before he taught them.

Perhaps it is fair to say that we never really know the effect a good priest has on the faith life of a parish and on the individual journeys of so many of us.

As Monsignor Cini is laid to rest tomorrow (*Monday 1/16 – 11 a.m. Funeral Mass at St. Elizabeth Church in Wilmington*), please say a prayer for the repose of his soul, and ask him to intercede for our beloved parish and the diocese. May his prayers bring us the holy priests, religious and faithful laity for whom he himself poured out his own life in service as a priest of Jesus Christ.

Our Lady, Queen of the Clergy and Mother of priests, pray for him.

St. Ann, pray for us.


