#### VARSITY SKI TEAMS START PINE KNOB SEASON WITH WINS

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Varsity Ski teams both began their seasons with Giant Slalom and Slalom wins in the Pine Knob High School League over Clarkston, Rochester Adams, and Cranbrook. # BOYS SWIM COMPETES AT TRI-MEET

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swim team competed in a tri-meet on Tuesday. The Irish defeated Brandon/Goodrich 85-80 and fell to Davison 91-78. Highlights included another State Cut time for Pierce Marchese, this time in the 100 Backstroke (57.12). Marchese also won the 200 Freestyle. Anthony Garrett finished second in the 100 Butterfly and 200 IM. Edziu Lis finished second in the 100 Free and second in the 50 Free. John Louis took second in the 500 Free, and Lucas Marchese finished third in both the 100 Breaststroke and the 100 Butterfly. The 4x100 Freestyle Relay (Garrett, Lis, Louis, Pierce Marchese) were also meet winners going away. The meet also saw time improvements for Hunter Pugliese in the 100 Breaststroke, Ethan Fitzpatrick and Aaron Hall in the 200 Freestyle and Oliver Kugler in the 500 Freestyle."The boys are just getting off a long Christmas break without meets which is mentally tough. They put in three solid, hard weeks of workouts. We are now ready to tackle the season." said Coach McGreevy, who also believes the boys will see many solid time drops before the Oakland County Meet in February.

The Notre Dame Boys JV basketball team came back from the Christmas break with a pair of home games against Goodrich and Birmingham Groves Against Goodrich, the evenly matched teams battled it out in the first half with the Irish squeaking out a 21-20 lead going into the locker room Coming out of the break, Notre Dame picked a bad time to go cold as the Martians outscored the Irish 14-8 in the third to take a 34-29 point lead into the fourth. The Irish cut the deficit to one several times but could not get over the hump and lost a tough one, 44-39. Mark Galle, Josh Laura and Colin Whalen led the team on the defensive end helping to hold Goodrich well below their season average. Leading the Irish on the offensive end of the floor was Sam Stowe (13 points), Drake Roa (eight), Lucas Kattula (five) with Michael Khouri and Nico Fandino both adding four points each. In the following game, the Irish matched up against the Falcons from Birmingham Groves The Falcons came out of the gate on fire while the Irish could not buy a bucket. After 16 minutes of play, Groves took a 33-19 lead into the half. The third quarter was much the same as the Falcons outscored the Irish 16-8 and took a commanding 49-27 lead into the fourth. In the fourth, the Irish changed it up with a 3/4 trapping press as well as Whalen, Fandino and Stowe finding their strokes to cut the lead to three with 1:30 minutes to go. Then, with 30 seconds left and down two, the Irish had an open look to tie the game

but the shot rattled in and out. Even after scoring an amazing 29 points in the fourth quarter, the Irish ended up three points short, losing 59-56 Stowe led the Irish with 20 points and six rebounds followed by Whalen with 12 points and two rebounds.
