How can students earn college credit?



Through a partnership with Saint Mary's University of Minnesota and by taking advantage of the Advanced Placement course opportunities, students at Newman Catholic High School have the ability to earn college credits all while meeting high school requirements. By taking advantage of the dual credit opportunities, the class of 2018 earned 154 college credits; saving \$85,914 in college tuition.

St. Mary's University Program for Advanced College Credit (PACC): Dual Enrollment

Newman Catholic High School (NCHS) partners with Saint Mary's University of Minnesota as a participant in their Program for Advanced College Credit (PACC). The five classes that NCHS offers hold the same expectations, workload, learning activities, projects and exams as Saint Mary's college courses. Completion of these courses earns students both college and high school credit. Approved instructors are certified by the Saint Mary's University of Minnesota PACC Program and work with Saint Mary's faculty to ensure that the courses are being taught at the University's standards.

Advanced Placement (AP):

Advanced Placement (AP) courses provide exposure to college level coursework. Success on AP coursework is a good indication of college readiness. If a student is interested in earning college level credit for an AP course, the Advancement Placement Exam for that subject must be taken. Typically a score of 3 or above (1-5 scale) is considered passing; however, some schools require a score of 4 or 5 for a direct transfer.
