Local Education Agency (LEA) Application for the Elementary and Secondary

School Emergency Relief Funds

The Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) received approval of our application for funding from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) fund of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) due to COVID-19. As a result, on May 18, 2020, you received an email from Mr. Barry Kachelhofer with the ALSDE LEA Accounting Section, which identified the allocation available for your district from the CARES Act.

The ALSDE has implemented a simplified electronic process to apply for the funds for your district. A copy of the application is attached to this memorandum. You can also access the application by clicking here. Prior to the completion of this application, it is important that your district conduct a needs assessment to determine priority areas due to the possibility of COVID-19 returning in the fall. Within the application, there is a list of assurances and a detailed budget section associated with the utilization of the requested funds. In addition, the application requires districts to include a narrative explaining how these funds will be utilized to promote remote learning. Districts are also required to provide equitable services to nonpublic schools following Section 1117 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) with the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) funds. Districts will submit the completed application to CARESapp@alsde.edu.

PROGRAMMATIC, FISCAL, AND REPORTING ASSURANCES

The United States Department of Education (USED) has approved the application from the State of Alabama for ESSER funds under the CARES Act. The availability of funds is from 4/29/2020 to 4/29/2021. LEAs will be allowed to expend funds until 9/30/2022. Pre-award costs to the ESSER fund will be allowed for allowable cost incurred on or after March 13, 2020.

2. Allowable Service(s) Assurance

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies that:

The LEA will use ESSER funds for activities allowable under section 18003(d) of Division B of the CARES Act. The United States Department of Education does not consider the following to be an allowable use of ESSER funds, under any part of 18003: 1) subsidizing or offsetting executive salaries and benefits of individuals who are not employees of the SEA or LEAs or 2) expenditures related to state or local teacher or faculty unions or associations.

How will the LEA determine the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19?

The Winston County Board of Education determined the most important educational needs as a result of COVID-19 by conducting district surveys to assess our students' access to technology needed to support virtual learning opportunities. The Board also considered federal and state guidelines regarding safely reopening schools to students, faculty, and staff. Likewise, the Board considered the need to maintain the operation of continuity of services in our schools.

How does the LEA intend to assess and address student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services?

The Winston County Board of Education will assess student learning gaps resulting from the disruption in educational services by administering high-quality, grade-appropriate assessments. The Board will address identified learning gaps by providing appropriate intervention and technology resources to all students in a safe school environment.

What is the LEA's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to students and staff?

The Winston County Board of Education's proposed timeline for providing services and assistance to the students and staff will be as soon as the application is approved. The Board anticipates that all funds will be expended by September 30,2022.

How will the LEA use ESSER funds to promote remote learning?

The Winston County Board of Education will use ESSER funds to promote remote learning by providing our students and parents with mobile WiFi solutions strategically placed across our county. The Board will also use ESSER funds to promote remote learning by utilizing Reading Horizons software that can be utilized in both classroom and remote learning settings. Likewise, the board will use ESSER funds to promote remote learning by making necessary upgrades to our district web page, which will allow students and parents easier access and navigation to our remote learning platforms.

3. Equitable Services Assurances

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools as required under Section 18005 of Division B of the CARES Act.
- The LEA receiving ESSER funds will provide equitable services to students and teachers in non-public schools located within the LEA in the same manner as provided under Section 1117 of the ESEA, as determined through timely and meaningful consultation with representatives of non-public schools.

4. Other Assurances and Certifications

The LEA Superintendent or his/her authorized representative assures or certifies the following:

- The LEA that receives ESSER funds will, to the greatest extent practicable, continue to compensate its employees and contractors during the period of any disruptions or closures related to COVID-19 in compliance with Section 18006 of Division B of the CARES Act. In addition, LEAs that accept funds will continue to pay employees and contractors to the greatest extent practicable based on the unique financial circumstances of the LEA. CARES Act funds generally will not be used for bonuses, merit pay, or similar expenditures, unless related to disruptions or closures resulting from COVID-19.
- The LEA will request technical assistance on the use of ESSER funds for remote learning, which includes both distance education as defined in Section 103(7) of the HEA and distance learning as defined in ESEA Section 8101(14), so that students can continue learning during school closures.

5. Section 442 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) Each local educational agency which participates in an applicable program under which Federal funds are made available to such agency through a State agency or board shall submit to such agency or board a general application containing the assurances set forth in subsection (b). The application shall cover the participation by that local educational agency in all such programs.
- (b) The general application submitted by a local education agency under subsection (a) shall set forth assurances
- (1) that the local educational agency will administer each program by the application in accordance with all applicable statutes, regulations, program plans, and applications;
- (2) that the control of funds provided to the local educational agency under each program, and title to property acquired with those funds, will be in a public agency and that a public agency will administer those funds and property;
- (3) that the local educational agency will use fiscal control and fund accounting procedures that will ensure proper disbursement of, and accounting for, Federal funds paid to that agency under each program;
- (4) that the local educational agency will make reports to the State agency or board and to the Secretary as may reasonably be necessary to enable the State agency or board and the Secretary to perform their duties and that the local educational agency will maintain such records, including the records required under section 443, and provide access to those records, as the State agency or board or the Secretary deem necessary to perform their duties;
- (5) that the local educational agency will provide reasonable opportunities for the participation by teachers, parents, and other interested agencies, organizations, and individuals in the planning for and operation of each program;
- (6) that any application, evaluation, periodic program plan or report relating to each program will be made readily available to parents and other members of the general public;
 - (7) that in the case of any project involving construction -
 - (A) the project is not inconsistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities, and (B) in developing plans for construction, due consideration will be given to excellence of architecture and design and to compliance with standards prescribed by the Secretary under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 in order to ensure that facilities constructed with the use of Federal funds are accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities;
- (8) that the local educational agency has adopted effective procedures for acquiring and disseminating to teachers and administrators participating in each program significant information from educational research, demonstrations, and similar projects, and for adopting, where appropriate, promising educational practices developed through such projects; and
- (9) that none of the funds expended under any applicable program will be used to acquire equipment (including computer software) in any instance in which such acquisition results in a direct financial benefit to any organization representing the interests of the purchasing entity or its employees or any affiliate of such an organization.
- (c) A general application submitted under this section shall remain in effect for the duration of the program it covers. The State agencies or boards administering the programs covered by the application shall not require the submission or amendment of such application unless required by changes in Federal or State law or by other significant change in the circumstances affecting an assurance in such application.

6. Section 427 of the General Education Provisions Act Assurances

- (a) The purpose of this section is to assist the Department in implementing the Department's mission to ensure equal access to education and to promote educational excellence throughout the Nation, by -
- (1) ensuring equal opportunities to participate for all eligible students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in any project or activity carried out under an applicable program; and
 - (2) promoting the ability of such students, teachers, and beneficiaries to meet high standards.
- (b) The Secretary shall require each applicant for assistance under an applicable program (other than an individual) to develop and describe in such applicant's application the steps such applicant proposes to take to ensure equitable access to, and equitable participation in, the project or activity to be conducted with such assistance, by addressing the special needs of students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries in order to overcome barriers to equitable participation, including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age.
- (c) The Secretary may establish criteria and provide technical assistance for meeting the requirements of this section.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter in any way the rights or responsibilities established under the laws cited in section 400(d) of this Act.

What steps does the LEA propose to take to permit students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries to overcome barriers (including barriers based on gender, race, color, national origin, disability, and age) that impede equal access to, or participation in, the program?

No participant will be denied participation in program activities based upon their gender, race, color, nation origin, age, or any disability. If any barriers arise, the Board will handle them as quickly as possible.
