

Scholarship Funding Options

OUR PARTNERSHIP

The Elmbrook Education Foundation (EEF) works in collaboration with the Waukesha County Community Foundation to ensure our scholarship practices meet the current preferences of donors while also looking toward long-term opportunities. While scholarship administration is a complex process, it is vital to the continued support of our students as they pursue their educational and professional goals. Understanding that financial situations vary throughout one's lifetime, we offer flexible options for scholarship funding.

PASS THROUGH SCHOLARSHIP (1 YEAR)

- Make a donation to the Current Scholarship Fund of the Elmbrook Education Foundation, Minimum \$1,500, 2% fee assessed at time of gift

DEDICATED SCHOLARSHIP (RECURRING)

- Create a non-endowed scholarship fund. Minimum \$5,000 establishing funds, 2% fee assessed at time of gift, money must be spent down in 5 years

- Create an endowed Restricted Scholarship Fund. Minimum \$10,000 establishing funds, 1% fee assessed annually

GROW YOUR INVESTMENT

- Want to invest, but need to start slowly? Consider starting an *Artesian Fund* that increases with continued contributions over time. Minimum \$1,000 establishing funds and a pledge to grow to a Restricted Scholarship Fund (\$10,000) within 10 years, 1% fee assessed annually
- Facilitate a pass through scholarship by donating to the EEF Current Scholarship Fund as detailed above
