

That's how many credits you need to earn a diploma



Credits Count!

...what's a credit?

- Each class is worth 5 credits per semester
- If you pass all your classes you will earn 40 credits per semester and 80 credits per year

$$80 + 80 + 80 + 80 = 320$$



Graduation Requirements

- Social Science: 35 credits
- **English:** 40 credits
- **Science:** 20 credits
- Math: 30 credits
- Fine Art, CTE or World Language: 10 credits
- State Requirements: 5 credits
- Physical Education: 20 credits
- **Electives:** 100 credits



A-G Requirements

A-G requirements are the requirements to be able to apply to a California University (CSU or UC) during your senior year of high school.

We encourage all student to complete the A-G requirements to keep their options open.

These classes must be completed with a "C" or better.

- Many Others




Languages Other Than English

(LOTE)

Spanish is the second most spoken language in the world and the US and studies have shown that Spanish is becoming increasingly important in the professions of healthcare, law enforcement, education, and business.


Native Spanish

Ag Pathways

Agriculture & Animal Science

Ag sciences start with Ag Biology & Intro to Ag as a freshman. There are 3 years offered with options including agriculture and animal sciences.

Welding

Welding is an amazing program only offered to 10th-12th graders. But Intro to Ag (comes with Ag Biology) includes an introduction to welding.

Floral Design

There are 3 years of Floral Design offered. This satisfies A-G fine art category and qualifies students to participate in FFA.



Child & Adolescent Development (Education Pathway)

Come study the physical, cognitive, language, social, and emotional developmental stages of children from conception through adolescence.

In this class you learn about many aspects of growing up and it is the beginning of a pathway to work with children in the future.







Engineering

Engineering is the pathway where you learn the process of design, testing, and manufacturing the things that we use everyday.

Intro to Engineering is the first class in the pathway and is open to 9th graders.

Multimedia Production

Intro to Multimedia Production is the first class in this pathway which studies film, video, computer, and live production.


They learn computer design, film and video production, lighting, sound, plus project production design and print media design.






