



CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS


7TH GRADE MATH WITH MS. SHARP



This week in math, 7th graders continued practicing how to multiply and divide positive and







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negative rational numbers. They discovered that a pattern where an odd amount of negative numbers results in a negative answer and an even amount of odd numbers results in a positive answer. We practiced how to cross-simplify to make multiplication easier, and we reviewed how long division works with decimals. 7th graders have worked hard this week and it will pay off when they take an assessment on the concepts.

5TH GRADE MATH WITH MS. NOLBY

5th graders have been having fun with *acgebra*. We learned about the rules for Order of Operations and evaluating numerical expressions. We used the phrase "Please Excuse My Dear Aunt Sally". Students understand that parentheses serve an important purpose in math. Students have also been displaying measurement data in line plots and solving problems using the data. Next, we moved on to Algebraic expressions and how to solve (1) solve one- and two-step equations, (2) evaluate expressions when given the value of a variable, and (3) use the associative, commutative, and distributive properties. We are focusing on decimals; rounding, comparing, adding, subtracting, and now multiplying decimals. It is so great when students understand how important math is in everyday life.
