

BOARD OFFICERS

The president of the school board shall preside at all meetings of the Board, decide questions of order, and appoint any fact-finding or advisory committees so authorized by the Board.

1. The president shall have the same right as other members to offer resolutions, to make motions or second motions, to discuss questions, and vote thereon.
2. The president shall call, or cause the executive secretary to call, special meetings of the board.
3. The president shall sign official district documents that require the signature of this office.
4. The president shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by law or by action of the school board.

The vice-president shall, in the absence or disability of the president, act in his stead.

In the absence of both the president and vice-president, the immediate past president shall act in his/her stead. This order of progression shall continue through all remaining past presidents, in descending order. If there are no past presidents available, the descending order will go to the Board member with the most time served on the Board.

If the Board presidency should become vacant, the position shall be assumed by the vice-president. Whenever the vice-presidency position is vacated as a result thereof, a new vice-president shall be elected by the Board members within 30 days. This may be done at a special meeting called by the president upon appropriate posting of such or during a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board.
