Knights Outlast Indians for 16-14 Victory

It wasn't the prettiest of football games ever played, but then again, Sussex Central head football coach Dave Bloodsworth isn't as interested in the beauty as much as he is in the final outcome — a 16-14 squeaker past Indian River to open the 1983 football season last Friday night in Frankford.

And, as in most rivalries, this game also had its moment of controversy in the final seconds of the contest when there was some question as to whether or not the Indian defense had downed Central quarterback Bill Savage in his endzone for a touchback and two points that would have given Indian River a 16-16 tie. But, as players questioned the call and Indian River coaches steamed on the sidelines, the seconds ticked away and the ref tossed the ball up indicating fate was with the Golden Knights.

"It was a quarterback sneak," said Bloodsworth, referring to the last play of the game. "On a quarterback sneak you're not going to lose yardage. Savage had the momentum forward. I think the refs made the right call."

Despite the last play controversy Bloodsworth had his hands full handling the Indian offense in the second half after taking a 16-6 lead in the first half. He also had problems handling his own offense in the second half when the Indians came out and held Central to no first downs and minus 10 yards rushing.

"I'll tell you, Indian River has a decent ball club," said Bloodsworth. "He (IR coach Dale Steele) surprised me on defense. He's got good size and speed in his defensive linemen." "But I don't think Indian River took anything away from us (in the second half). We were executing poorly, we were missing blocks, we tried to give them the game in the last quarter. This same thing has happened in all of our pre-season scrimmages. The team would go out and play 24 minutes in the first half, then forget about the other 24 minutes in the second half."

If second half intensity is lacking, then Bloodsworth is going to have to do some motivating this week as Central prepares to tangle with Seaford at home this Friday night. "Seaford is quick and they're good hitters. The key to beating Seaford is going to be stopping (Greg) Stanley, their biggest offensive threat," said Bloodsworth relating the book on the Blue Jays.

KNIGHT NOTES: Bloodsworth named two players as Player of the Week. Bill Savage, who went 2 for 4 passing with one TD and one point after pass conversion, also contributed eight solo tackles from his free safety position on defense and, according to Bloodsworth, "displayed great leadership ability". Demetrius Taylor, who chewed up 60 yards on 13 carries on offense, also "played a beautiful defensive end", according to Bloodsworth, making five solo tackles and four assists. "He's got great leg drive as a halfback and he was breaking tackles all night."

Jeff Shockley, who was in a halfback position, will be moved back to offensive end this Friday night and from inside linebacker to oustide linebacker on defense.

Ruling Gives Indians 16-16 Tie with Sussex Central

A Henlopen Conference committee Monday night decided to award Indian River High School's football team a 16-16 tie with Sussex Central in a game played September 16 in Frankford.

The ruling, prompted by a protest from Indian River coaches and administrators as well as an admission by game officials that they had erred on the controversial last play of the game, took away Sussex Central's 16-14 victory in the non-conference matchup.

That controversial play came with three seconds left in the game when Central quarterback Bill Savage ran a quarterback sneak up the middle. Indian River players and coaches felt they had stopped Savage in the endzone for


a two-point safety. However, as coaches and players argued the matter, the officials tossed up the ball signaling the end of the contest.

Indian River head coach, Dale Steele, who said a day after the game that he would not file a protest with the conference, later changed his mind when Delmarva Officials Association president Joe Koniencki admitted that game officials had made an error on the play and had failed to call the safety which would have tied the game.

The Henlopen fact-finding committee that made the ruling consisted of chairman Vern Walch of Milford, Charles Williams and Ron Eby of Smyrna and Jim Harvey of Caesar Rodney.

However, the ruling may not be final. Though Sussex Central head coach Dave Bloodsworth was not reached by the *County Post* for comment, the Delaware State News reported Tuesday that he promised to appeal the decision. "We're not pleased...we're going to fight for what is right," Bloodsworth was quoted. in the story. Bloodsworth added that he felt Indian River did not follow the correct procedure in protesting the game because the protest wasn't filed when the game occured and he was not notified of the protest immediately, as Henlopen Conference rules call for.

Bloodsworth went on to add that he had a videotape of the play but that the Henlopen committee didn't seem interested in seeing it.



Seaford Shuts Down Sussex Central, 33-0

Despite averaging more than 100 yards in penalties for the game, the Seaford Blue Jays scored in the second quarter Friday night and never looked back as they blanked Sussex Central 33-0 in Heniopen Conference football action.

The Knights coughed the ball up on their own 34 yard line late in the second quarter giving Seaford the opportunity to score first and knock the wind out of Central's sails. Seaford's victory avenges a 26-0 loss handed to them last year by Central, their only loss of the season enroute to a state Division I title.
