Attendance Challenge (DON'T GET TO 15)

Chronic absenteeism can cause poor grades and is defined as **missing at least 10 percent (18 days) of days in a school year for any reason, including excused and unexcused absences**. Currently 55% of students have been identified as chronically absent per the state of Michigan. Whoo hoo, third grade chronic absenteeism has decreased.

Thank you for your support and diligence throughout this year! We are nearing the midpoint of the school year, which means there are less than 30 days left in Quarter 2/Semester 1. We encourage students to FINISH Strong! The weather is cold, the sun is hiding, but we MUST finish the year by attending school everyday on time! Every day counts as each day missed equals 7 hours of instructional time missed. We look forward to seeing ALL of our scholars daily in school. Remember that 2 absences per month will cause a student to be Chronically Absent by the end of the school year.

The number that we want to do our best to avoid is **15** (by the end of the year). If your child is currently below this number of absences, he or she can finish the year strong and not become Chronically Absent. If your child has exceeded this number for the year, it is critical that he/she is in school daily, on time.





Read & Respond Homework


