The SHAC meeting was called to order at 1:30pm by Dr. Lori Nunez. She welcomed all in attendance and discussed the agenda for today's SHAC meeting.

The meeting minutes from November 16, 2021, were reviewed and approved.

### **Nutritional Services:**

Jack Aspinall introduced Wendy Obregon, AISD's new Director of Child Nutrition. Mr. Aspinall reviewed the results of AISD's Child Nutrition audit from the fall. He explained the one error that was noted on a menu item, not having enough "orange" vegetables. Mr. Aspinall informed the Council that additional spices, within certain meals, were being adjusted so that students favored the flavors. Some experiment recipes have been shared at Lillian Elementary and they have shown to be successful with the scholars.

### **Physical Education:**

Dr. Nunez gave an update on the textbook adoption, Proclamation of 2022. She shared the interests of the PE Teachers and noted that she will continue to keep the Council updated as new publishers are submitted to TEA. Dr. Nunez encouraged the PE Teachers that are interested in attending the TAHPERD Summer Conference to contact Mrs. Isbeth Hernandez for registration. Lindsay Farmer, PE teacher at LES, shared information on the FitnessGram. It was noted that all AIS, AJH and AHS PE teachers have started their assessment. All results are due to Dr. Nunez by May 25.

**Health Services:**

Nurse Jennifer Davis updated the Council with monthly totals from November to March of this school year with trending diagnoses that have been reported in the District Healthcare Clinic. She shared the positive feedback that the District Healthcare Clinic has received due to the availability of service and treatment by Goodside Health. There are future plans of the clinic extending services to educators' immediate household. Dr. Nunez spoke about Narcan, an opioid overdose treatment and how it treats suspected emergency signs of opioid overdose. She informed the Council that future training for all educators is in the planning stage, along with creating a District Policy for the use of the treatment.

**Parent and Community Involvement:**

Dr. Nunez led the discussion on planning for the SHAC Family Night. Council members collaborated in multiple groups and brainstormed ways to involve the whole family with activities throughout the night. All brainstorming ideas were recorded on post-it notes. Dr. Nunez informed the Council that planning would begin immediately with the ideas generated within the meeting today. The Family Night would be held at the Charles Head Stadium on Thursday, April 14, 2022 beginning at 5:30pm and ending at 8:30pm.
