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School and Community

- Four-year comprehensive public high school, 20 miles north of Chicago
- Approximately 2100 students evenly split amongst grades 9 -12
- Glenbrook School District 225 also including Glenbrook South and Glenbrook Off-Campus
- 195 certified staff members with 86% holding a master's degree or higher
- 15:1 student-teacher ratio
- Ranked #3/703 Best Public High School Teachers in Illinois; #7/719 in public high schools in Illinois; #8/661 Best College Prep Public High Schools in Illinois by Niche.com

Academic Information and Reporting

- Glenbrook North is on a block schedule; 4 - 90 minute classes rotating every other day for a total of 8 class periods
- Traditional calendar: 2 semesters, fall semester ending in late January, spring semester ending in early June; Summer school available mostly for credit recovery.
- Glenbrook Scholars designation is awarded to those students who have earned a weighted GPA of 4.500 or higher at the end of the 7th semester.
- Honor Roll designation is per semester when a student earns a 3.300 or higher
- National Honors Society recognition to those students who met the minimum qualifications of a 3.500 GPA at the end of the 5th semester; additional application is required.

Course Designations and Numbering

First Digit = Sequence in Series of Courses

- 1 denotes first course
- 2 denotes second year course
- 3 denotes third year course
- 4 denotes fourth year course
- 5 denotes fifth year course

Second Digit = Academic level

- 9 denotes Academy* (see page 2)
- 8 denotes Advanced Placement
- 7 denotes Honors
- 6 denotes Regular/G/GT/GTA

Third Digit = Sequence within the Course

- 1 - denotes first-semester course content
- 2 - denotes second-semester course content
- 3 - denotes first and second-semester course content

EXAMPLE: English 263 is a second-year English course (2), regular level (6), year-long course (3)

Two grade point averages based on a 4.0 scale are computed for each student: weighted GPA includes courses in the areas of English, mathematics, science, social studies, world language, or other elective courses at the honors, advanced placement, or Academy level; Unweighted GPA includes all courses, no waiting system is used, and all courses are considered of equal value. Letter grades noted with an asterisk earned from outside the district are recorded on transcript but not included in GPA calculation. **Class Rank:** Grade point averages are not to be used to determine a class rank for students. No information indicating a relative class rank using either the unweighted or weighted grade point averages will be issued internally or externally to staff, students, parents, other academic institutions, or agencies.

Important Notes Regarding AP: 49 honors and 23 Advanced Placement offered

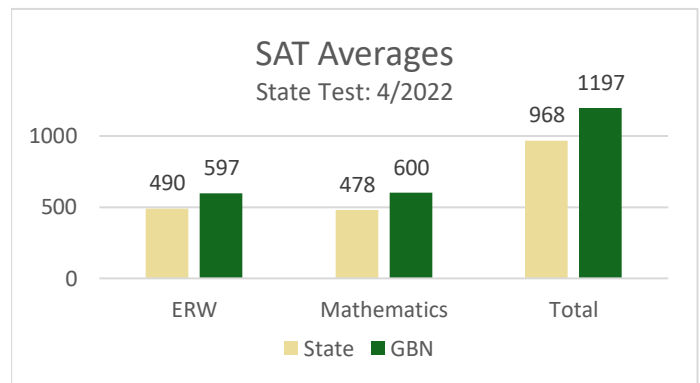
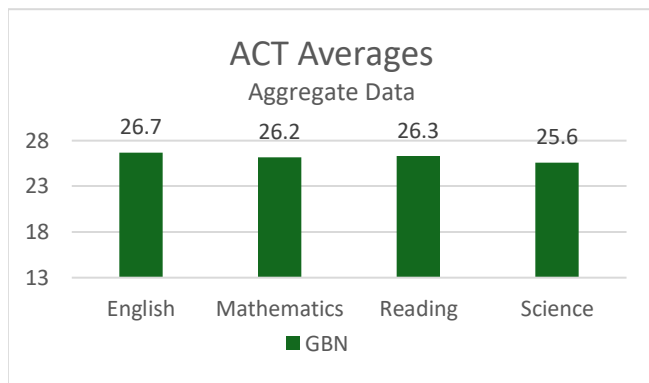
Freshman: Not available to taking AP designated courses (few exceptions allowed)
 Sophomore: AP Macro, AP European, or AP Modern World History only AP courses available with a few math and science exceptions
 Junior: AP US Hist. only available junior year; Hnrs. Am. Exp. only honors course
 Senior: A physics course is a prerequisite to AP Physics I. Also, an intro course is required to take corresponding AP science course. i.e. must have biology to take AP Biology.
