


# ICT - WHO ARE DASH AND DOT?

Year 5 have been working on their programming skills with the Dash robots. This week we have been investigating how to draw different shapes using loops to simplify our code.

Dash and Dot are exciting, hands-on learning tools for teaching creative problem solving, coding and robotics and they give the pupils a head start on learning fundamental STEM principles and 21st-century skills. Connecting Dash and Dot to an iPad via Bluetooth, the pupils can send commands to get them to move, to light them up, and to detect the world around them. Both Dash and Dot are capable of interacting with their surroundings and thanks to inbuilt sensors they can detect sounds, movements and other objects.




This week the year 3's produced sandwiches independently. They also learnt about the importance of a balanced lunch and were able to identify carbohydrates and proteins. 7

Year 5 have been experimenting with Friction as part of their Fascinating Forces project. They have rolled marbles down different surfaces, predicting which surfaces would be the quickest and slowest for the marble to roll down and then timing to find out. They have then graphed their results beautifully, great work Year 5!



## FOOTBALL





# UNUSUAL FOODS
