Building success at school for students with a diagnosed disorder



Who is eligible to enroll in the program?

A student may be considered for the “Success for all Students” program if they have a diagnosed learning/medical/attention/social disorder that inhibits or interferes with the skill of learning, which includes problems in speaking, listening, reading, writing, mathematical ability or impairment in social interaction.

How do I enroll my child in the program?

- Submit paperwork showing a professional diagnosis of a learning/medical/attention/social disorder to the Elementary Academic Support Team (AS).
- Approval for this program would be determined by the Academic Support Department based on the need seen by teachers and administrators.

What is needed for my child to receive services over multiple years?

A child continues to be eligible for accommodations if the date on his/her educational testing is within three years of the current school year and/or the medical diagnosis is presently being monitored by your child’s pediatrician. Parents must reenroll their child each year to remain in the program.



Is there an additional fee to enroll in the SFAS program?

The cost for SFAS enrollment is an additional fee per academic school year. This fee is in addition to regular tuition payments. If enrollment occurs during the school year, the cost will be pro-rated according to the same schedule on the tuition contract.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

How will the SFAS program benefit my child?

- 1 **ACCOMODATIONS**
The AS Team will meet with the teachers to educate them about the disorder, provide a list of appropriate accommodations to implement in class and develop strategies to meet the accommodations.
- 2 **PARTNERSHIP**
The AS Team will partner with parents and teachers to update the plan as deemed necessary through discussions and observations.
- 3 **SUPPORT**
Individualized support in the AS classroom for various academic skills.
