- *Habit 3: Put First Things First* - Live by your values and beliefs. Respect others' values and beliefs.
- *Habit 4: Think Win-Win* - Everyone can win: think of mutual benefit with others.
- *Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood* - Listen before you talk. Seek to understand others and to be understood by others. Every person deserves a voice.
- *Habit 6: Synergize* - Creatively cooperate with others. Be open to all ideas, thoughts, and beliefs.
- *Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw* - Balance feels best. Continuously renew your body, mind, heart, and spirit. Engage in educating yourself and your child about values, beliefs, and cultures that are different from your own.

When parents encourage learning and living the 7 Habits, they are teaching their students to respect diversity while always acting with integrity to their own principles and values.
