

### College Planning Timeline

### 9TH GRADE

- Explore clubs and activities
- Seek out volunteer opportunities
- Start a resume
- Schedule an individual meeting with your counselor
- Sign up for Raise.Me Scholarship Program

### 10TH GRADE

- Focus on academics
- Try a new club or activity
- Take the in-school Pre-ACT in April (no registration required)
- Make a study plan for any AP exams (if applicable)

#### 11 GRADE

- Take the PSAT in October
- Attend EVHS college representative visits
- Campus visits
- Spring: Take the ACT/SAT
- Schedule a post high school meeting with your counselor

#### 12TH GRADE

- Schedule college planning meeting with your counselor
- Complete and submit college applications (11/1, 11/15, 12/1)
- October 1 Complete FAFSA
- Apply for Scholarships
- May 1 College Decision Day

## Additional Ways Your Teen Can Prepare for College



### **PERSONAL**

- Set up a healthy sleep schedule on weeknights
- Develop healthy eating habits
- Find ways to deepen involvement and gain leadership experience
- · Learn how to build advocacy skills

### **ACADEMIC**

- Continue to develop advocacy skills. Encourage them to meet and email with their teachers as needed.
- Develop or strengthen study habits, calendar use, time management, and planning skills
- Meet with their counselor at least once a year to help with course planning and goal setting
- Read! (Best possible preparation for standardized tests)

### COLLEGE

- Consider setting up a separate email address for all college communication
- Become familiar with Naviance starting in 9th grade
- Develop a family communication plan about how and when college planning will be discussed


## Ways to Explore Colleges Early

- Visit a small, medium, and large school in the area if you can't travel to an out-of-state college

### Admission Criteria



### Holistic Review

- Strong grades/GPA Most Important!
- Rigor of coursework
- Essays (if required)
- ACT/SAT scores (if required)
- Letters of recommendation (if required)
- Extracurricular Activities
- Volunteerism
- Leadership experience



## Admission Test Requirements



### ACT/SAT

- Recommend ACT or SAT be taken in the spring of junior year. Writing portion is not required.
- Impact of COVID: Test optional wave gets bigger!
- Over 1800+ colleges are test optional for Fall 2023 applicants
- Students won't be subject to penalty if they do not present a test score during the upcoming admission cycle
- Scholarships-Vast majority will NOT be penalized for not reporting a score
- Full list of test optional colleges/universities: www.fairtest.org
- Test Prep Tips:
  - Lots of free test prep options online and in Naviance
  - If taking a prep class, think about taking it as close to the test date as possible



# Paying for College



## Talk about Money Early in the Process

- Money is usually a major limiting factor affecting college choice
- Students can't make responsible plans without knowing your family's financial limits
- Discuss what you can and/or are willing to contribute



## Paying for College: Timeline for Families

### 9TH GRADE

- Run the Net Price Calculator on the websites of a few colleges
- If you have not done so already, start saving for college

### 10TH GRADE

 January 1: Beginning of the base year on which financial aid calculations for the first year of college will be based

### 11 GRADE

- Initiate a conversation with your teen about what you are willing/able to spend on college
- Research costs and options for visiting college campuses over spring break/summer

### 12TH GRADE

- October 1: Compete and submit FAFSA.
- Inquire about scholarships (work/ community)
- Complete CSS Profile if needed
- Housing Deposit

## Division I and II Sports





### STUDENTS WHO INTEND TO PLAY DIVISION 1 AND II IN COLLEGE MUST MEET THE NCAA ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Create a free NCAA Profile Page Account
- Successful completion of a core curriculum of at least 16 specified academic courses (called 'Core Courses')
- Meet test score requirements
- Send transcript at the end of junior year
