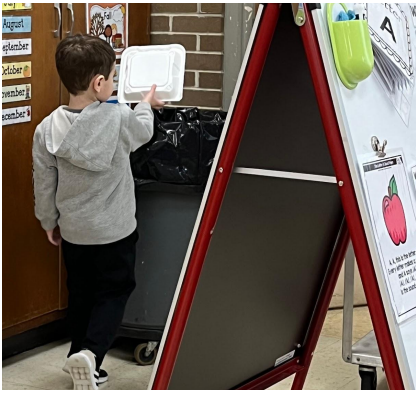


Preschool News

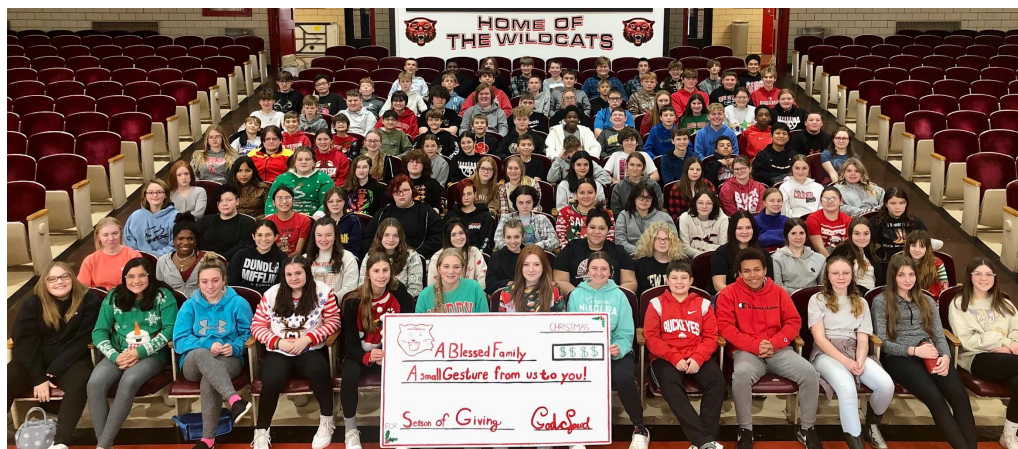

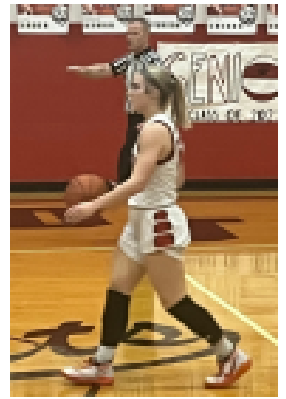

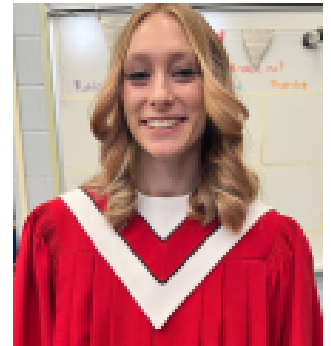
January 12, 2023
