

## **511 FUNDRAISING POLICY**

### **I. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to address student fundraising efforts.

### **II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY**

The school district recognizes a desire and a need by some student organizations for fundraising. The school district also recognizes a need for some constraint to prevent fundraising activities from becoming too numerous and overly demanding on employees, students and the general public.

### **III. RESPONSIBILITY**

- A. The school board or their designee has the authority to regulate all fundraising activities in the district. All fundraising activity must have prior approval of a building administrator, Activities Director or the Director of Community Education.
- B. Students in grades K-5 are prohibited from participating in fundraising activities involving door-to-door solicitations -- unless accompanied by a parent/guardian.
- C. Organizations donating to schools must meet the criteria established by the school district on fundraising. Pre-approval must be given for request(s) of funding from civic and charitable organizations.
- D. All fundraising monies will follow and comply with accepted accounting procedures as interpreted by the Director of Business Services.
- E. The Superintendent and district administration are responsible for developing procedures and guidelines to assist in the regulation of student fundraising.
- F. The school district expects all students who participate in approved fundraising activities to represent the school, the student organization and the community in a responsible manner. All rules pertaining to student conduct and student discipline extend to student fundraising activities.
- G. Contributions to a school become the property of the school district and are subject to the same controls and regulations that govern the use of other school-owned property. Control by the district includes the right to dispose of property that is no longer used, has become obsolete, or is rendered inoperable.
- H. The district will assure that the allocation of funds from its budget, booster clubs, unrestricted donations and gifts and other sources of financial and in-kind support does not create unjustified disparities for boy's and girl's teams in the area of athletic facilities.
