520 STUDENT SURVEYS

I. PURPOSE

Occasionally the school district utilizes surveys to obtain student opinions and information about students. The purpose of this policy is to establish the parameters of information that may be sought in student surveys.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Student Surveys may be conducted as determined necessary by the school district. Surveys, analyses and evaluations conducted as part of any program funded through the U.S. Department of Education must comply with 20 U.S.C. 1232h.

III. STUDENT SURVEYS IN GENERAL

- A. Student surveys will be conducted anonymously and in an indiscernible fashion. No mechanism will be used for identifying the participating student in any way. No attempt will be made in any way to identify a student survey participant. There will be no requirement that the student return the survey, and no record of the student returning a survey will be maintained.
- B. The superintendent or building administrator may choose not to approve a survey that seeks probing personal and/or sensitive information that could result in identifying the survey participant, or is discriminatory in nature based on age, race, color, sex, disability, religion, or national origin.
- C. Surveys containing questions pertaining to the student's or the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) personal beliefs or practices in sex, family life, morality and religion will not be administered unless the parent or guardian of the student is notified in writing that such survey is being administered and written consent is provided. Any and all documents containing the written permission of a parent for a student to participate in a survey will be maintained by the school district in a file separate from survey responses.
- D. Although the survey is conducted anonymously, potential exists for personally identifiable information to be provided in response thereto. To the extent that personally identifiable information of a student is contained in his or her responses to a survey, the school district will take appropriate steps to ensure the data is protected in accordance with Minn. Stat. Ch. 13 (Minnesota Government Data Practices Act), 20 U.S.C. 1232g (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) and 34 C.F.R. Part 99.

IV. STUDENT SURVEYS CONDUCTED AS PART OF DEPARTMENT OF **EDUCATION PROGRAM**

- All survey materials shall be available for review by parents/guardians prior to A. administration.
- B. No student shall be required, as part of any program funded in whole or in part by the U.S. Department of Education, without the prior consent of the student (if the student is an adult or emancipated minor), or in the case of an emancipated minor, without the prior written consent of the parent, to submit to a survey that reveals information concerning:
 - political affiliations; 1.
 - 2. mental and psychological problems potentially embarrassing to the student or the student's family;
 - 3. sex behavior and attitudes;
 - 4. illegal, antisocial, self-incriminating and demeaning behavior;
 - 5. critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close family relationships;
 - legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of 6. lawyers, physicians, and ministers; or
 - 7. income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program),
- C. The school district shall give parents and students notice of their rights under this section.
