TO QUALIFY:

- Must be between 16 and 24 at enrollment.
 - No longer enrolled in school
- And one (1) of the following:***
- School dropout
 - Homeless, runaway, foster youth, qualifies for SSI, or in an out-of-home placement
 - Pregnant or parenting
 - Subject to the Juvenile or Adult Justice System
 - Disabled
 - A low income individual who requires additional assistance to complete an educational program or to secure and hold employment

And Must Have in Their Possession

- All documents necessary to work - Social Security Card and a Current Picture ID (Driver's License or California ID)
