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Everything That's Included

Airfare and ground transportation



Terms and Conditions

ATTENDEE QUALIFICATIONS:

My student is between 15 and 18 years of age, or will be before July 11, 2023, is in good physical and mental health and is able to participate in all aspects of our program.

HEALTH

For the protection of all, my student will need a physical examination prior to attendance at Take the LEAP. I will submit the Health History and Medical Release Forms provided by Project LEAP. Project LEAP provides onsite basic first aid. Project LEAP reserves the right to charge parents for medical costs related to injury or illness of students. It is understood that unless otherwise indicated, my student is in good health. Any information, which may be pertinent to my student's health and welfare, will be provided to Project LEAP in writing. I will make note on the Health History Form of all types of medications, both prescription and nonprescription, that my student may be taking. All medications to be taken at summit will be delivered, in their original pharmacy container with sufficient doses to last for the duration of summit, to a summit representative at the time of check-in. Should anyone with whom my student has been associated become ill with a contagious disease within three weeks of my student's departure, I will notify Project LEAP at once. I understand that we are in the midst of a global pandemic and that the highly contagious nature of COVID-19, and the fact that individuals infected with COVID-19 may be asymptomatic, creates a risk of infection from any activity involving contact with others. I understand and acknowledge that I am responsible for reviewing the Project LEAP safety protocols for Take the LEAP and ensuring that I and my child(ren) follow those protocols. I acknowledge that Project LEAP has implemented reasonable preventative protocols, policies and procedures designed to reduce the spread of COVID-19 during Take the LEAP. I voluntarily assume the risk that my child(ren) may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 while attending Take the LEAP. I understand that Project LEAP may exclude my child(ren) from Take the LEAP in the event that I or my child(ren) fail to abide by Project LEAP's health and safety protocols, disrupt, impede or interfere with the operations of Take the LEAP, or threaten the health, safety or welfare of other participants or Project LEAP staff, and that no refund of any fees will be made in such circumstances.

EXPULSION

I understand that Project LEAP may, in its sole discretion, dismiss any participant for inappropriate, disrespectful, or dangerous behavior at any time. In this event, I understand that I will not receive a refund of fees for unattended days. If my child breaks or damages any property as a result of their direct or indirect behavior, I hereby agree to pay for its repair or replacement. Project LEAP further reserves the right to dismiss my student for violation of summit rules, misconduct or disruptive behavior or whose influence, in the opinion of the director, is not in the best interest of the summit. I am responsible for the expense and arrangements for sending my student home. There will be no refund.

EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION In the event of an emergency the parent/guardian will be contacted. In the event that an emergency occurs while the parent/guardian is traveling or otherwise unavailable, the office must be able to contact an alternate emergency contact. I will provide accurate and complete emergency contact information. The person listed on the emergency contact form of the application has agreed to be responsible for my student if I am absent or unavailable.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

We strongly believe that Take the LEAP is an opportunity for students to build relationships and learn to work with people different from themselves. Although we acknowledge the presence of different genders and identities, students will be housed with an additional student and chaperone of the same sex. All restrooms, showering, and sleeping rooms are to be used only by the occupants of the given room.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

Project LEAP is not responsible for articles of clothing or personal belongings that are lost or damaged. Project LEAP does not pay shipping for returned items. Unclaimed and unlabeled items at the end of the summit are donated. I will not allow my student to bring expensive radios, cameras, etc. Project LEAP is not responsible for personal vehicles of students who transport themselves to Take the LEAP, and such vehicles are subject to additional parking fees not covered by Project LEAP. Project LEAP is committed to creating a safe environment for all students, staff, volunteers, and visitors. For this reason, there may be times when a search of a student's living space or possessions may be warranted. A staff member who has reason to suspect, or has knowledge of, contraband or potentially harmful material will present his or her concerns to the acting director, who will decide whether a search should be made. A search of a student's possessions, when warranted, may include such items as backpacks, suitcases, duffel bags, footlockers, and electronic devices. If a weapon or controlled drug is located during a search, or discovered in any other fashion, the director may be required to notify the police. Possession of contraband or potentially harmful material may also result in disciplinary consequences, up to and including dismissal.

TRANSPORTATION

I will arrive on time for the scheduled drop-off and arrival times. Authorities will be called within one hour after the scheduled pick-up time if the student has not been picked up. When picking my student up I will check him/her out with a Project LEAP representative.

RELEASE OF STUDENTS

To protect the safety of our students, a designated guardian will be required to sign-out each student at pickup. A student's emergency contacts will automatically be set as their designated guardians for pick-up. Written consent from the parent/guardian must be received before any student is released to anyone other than the child's Emergency Contacts. Students will not be released to anyone during the Take the LEAP unless prior arrangements have been made through the Project LEAP or the Director has made direct contact with the parents beforehand.

PARENTAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISK

I have requested Project LEAP to allow my child to participate in its Take the LEAP program. As a condition of receiving this benefit, I, the undersigned, do hereby agree to the following: I understand that my child's participation in summit activities can expose him or her to dangers both from known and unanticipated risks. I understand that the Project LEAP may, in its sole discretion, dismiss any participant for inappropriate, disrespectful, or dangerous behavior at any time. In this event, I understand that I will not receive a refund of summit fees for unattended days. If my child breaks or damages any property as a result of their direct or indirect behavior, I hereby agree to pay for its repair or replacement. I understand that the risks associated with summit activities could result in injury and/or death to my child. I hereby assume these risks and, knowing them, hereby give my child permission to participate. I understand that the Project LEAP is not liable for any injuries or other occurrences due to indoor and outdoor summit activities or related risks, and/or the actions or omissions of Project LEAP counselors, volunteers, employees, trustees, directors, officers, or any other entities being released. In consideration of my application and permitting my child to participate in this activity, I hereby: WAIVE, RELEASE, AND DISCHARGE from any and all liability, including but not limited to, liability arising from the negligence or fault of the Project LEAP, its trustees, officers, employees, summit counselors, volunteers, entities or other persons released, for my child's death, disability, personal injury, property damage, property theft, or actions of any kind which may hereafter occur to them including their traveling to and from this activity; INDEMNIFY, HOLD HARMLESS, AND PROMISE NOT TO SUE the Project LEAP, its trustees, officers, employees, volunteers, or other entities or persons released from any and all liabilities or claims made as a result of participation in this activity, whether caused by the negligence of release or otherwise. The Accident Waiver and Release of Liability Form shall be construed broadly to provide a release and waiver to the maximum extent permissible under applicable law. The Project LEAP, its Trustees, directors, officers, and all its employees, acting officially or otherwise are hereby released from any and all claims, demands, actions, or causes of action on account of any injury to my child that may occur. This release binds my heirs, executors, administrators, and/or assigns.

Where will the conference take place?

Students will spend two (2) days at each of the following campuses:

- University of California San Diego (UCSD)
- University of San Diego (USD)
- San Diego State University (SDSU)

Where will students be housed?

Students will be housed at a nearby hotel. The official location of student housing is only given to accepted students.

What is your cancellation policy?

Any cancellations made by the attendee result in **no refund**.

- This includes cancellations due to illness, COVID-19, family emergencies or anything unexpected.
- Attendee sent home for disciplinary reasons or because of homesickness:

No refund.

- Attendee sent home due to illness, COVID 19 protocols, or injury: **No refund.**
- Attendee registrations cannot be traded or exchanged.

Can I book my student's flight?

No, in order to ensure student safety, all students will be placed on the same flight!

Are parents required to attend?

Parents are not required to attend however, they are permitted to attend the final

presentation and recognition dinner on July 16th. Dinner is provided by Project LEAP.

How many students attend the Take the LEAP Summit?

100 students are accepted to attend the Take the LEAP Summit.

Are students supervised at all times ?

Yes!

Do you provide transportation?

Project LEAP provides charter bus transportation that will pick your student up from the airport once they have arrived and will drop your student off at the airport to return home. More details are provided in a handbook for parents of accepted students.


How will my student fundraise?

FAQ and Contact Page

Do you offer any scholarships or discounts?

A \$250 discount is available to students referred by current Project LEAP students or Project LEAP alumni. If you were referred by a Project LEAP student, please list their name on the referral section of your application.

How much spending money should my student bring?

Students should bring about \$150-\$200 in spending money.

My student dietary restrictions, are there additional options available?

We offer a vegetarian and gluten free option at every meal. Students will sign up to be on the vegetarian list or gluten free list at the beginning of the summit. Any other dietary needs should be noted in the Medical Release Form.

Where do Take the LEAP Summit chaperones and students come from?

Project LEAP currently services students in 33 of the 50 United States! It is likely that students will meet students and chaperones from other states!

Can parents stay in the room with their students?

No. Parents must pay for their own room at a surrounding hotel.

Can I pick up/drop off my child everyday?

No, even local students are required to stay onsite.

Can my student go sightseeing/leave the premises with me?

Students must make arrangements to leave with parents with their chaperone. Any leaving of the premises is subject to approval by the Director of Programs.
