MASS OF PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE

On November 18, the Josephinum community celebrated the feast day of St. Philippine, as an important day for the Sacred Heart community. Born in Grenoble, France, Rose Philippine Duchesne was called to religious life at the early age of 18. However, it wasn't until she met Madeline Sophie Barat, the founder of The Society of the Sacred Heart, in 1804 that the two women established a new foundation for The Society.

In 1818, Philippine sailed to New Orleans with four other Religious of The Sacred Heart. After settling in the small village of St. Charles, they opened the first free school west of the Mississippi and the first Catholic school in what would later become the St. Louis Archdiocese. Rose Philippine Duchesne is deeply ingrained in the history of Josephinum Academy of the Sacred Heart. She was a pioneer, educator, and vowed religious whose fortitude, faith, courage, and humility continue to inspire us.


For the juniors, their focus also remains centered on human dignity with an emphasis on contemporary examples of human dignity violations. Students were presented with multiple thesis statements to choose from with the hope that they can defend or argue against these positions. The outcome will be a 6-page, double-spaced final paper that allows the students to showcase their skills within research and premise building. In the end, both groups should be able to articulate what human dignity is and how it's important in today's modern society.

THEOLOGY & CINEMA

The 12th-grade Theology and Cinema class continued analyzing films through a theological lens during the month of November. To honor the Day of The Dead, students watched *The Others,* a film about a woman and her two children who believe they are being haunted. As the plot unravels, you come to understand that it is the woman and her children who are actually dead. The film served as a conversation starter for the religious study of life after death. Students were asked to analyze the characters of the film and decide whether they were existing in Heaven, Hell, or Purgatory.
