- Tri-Tech is 3 periods program (3 periods at Tri-Tech and 3 periods at SHS).
- Transportation back and forth is included and lunch is offered onsite for convenience.
- Limited spots are available in each program (spots go to seniors first then juniors)
- Programs can give you equivalency credits and college credits
- Apply now! Go to Tri-Tech website to apply.
- During SHS registration: Sign up for 6 classes at SHS and choose "Tri-Tech Holding AM or PM" as your alternate.
- You will hear from Tri-Tech in April If you are accepted. At that point we will change your Southridge requests.

COLLEGE CREDIT OPTIONS



- CTE Dual Credit
 - Earn an 85% or higher in a CTE course to earn college credit for <u>FREE!</u>
- Advance Placement (AP)
 - College-bound, consider AP
 - Potential to earn college credit
 - National Exams given in May
- College in the High School (CiHS)
 - Earn college credit from universities while taking a course at Southridge (May also earn additional credit)
 - Must meet eligibility requirement from the institution offering college credit (test in Writing, Reading and/or Math)
 - Credits placed on high school transcript
 - Students pay the university for courses at a reduced rate (cost varies)



RUNNING START (11th & 12th)



- Earn college & high school credit at the same time
- Full-time or part-time (Potentially earn AA degree)
- Running Start Information Night: February 23rd at 6PM
- FREE Tuition for all classes
- CBC: In April take Placement Test
 (Accuplacer: Writing & Reading, Aleks: Math)
- WSU-TC: Meet Entrance Requirements (3.5 GPA, SAT/ACT), then take placement tests





Register for 6 classes (Drop SHS classes when qualify for RS)



STAMP TEST



- Available in multiple languages
- Students may earn World Language credits (up to 4 credits)
