HISTORY

Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School and Corporate Work Study Program was founded in 2007 as a member of the Cristo Rey Network. The Archdiocese of Washington invited the Salesians of Don Bosco of the St. Phillip the Apostle Province of New Rochelle, New York, to co-sponsor and co-found a 'Cristo Rey' model school in the Washington metropolitan area, and to imbue the educational approach of St. John Bosco into the new school. The educational vision of the Salesians of Don Bosco inspires all those at Don Bosco Cristo Rey to teach as Jesus taught and to imitate Him in all we say and do. The first Graduation took place on June 2, 2011 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC with 70 graduates who were all accepted to college. Since then, 100% of Don Bosco Cristo Rey graduates have continued to be accepted to college, receiving over \$16 million in merit and need based scholarships.

STUDENT BODY

The student body is composed of students in grades 9 through 12 from over 60 different zip codes from the Washington Metropolitan area. Over 24 countries of origin are represented in the student body. The first graduating class was in June 2011. 100% of the graduating seniors have been accepted into college each year.
