Visit Mary Nohl's Collection at the Art Preserve in Sheboygan

The Legacy of Mary Nohl (1914–2001)

In 1924, when Lake Michigan shores were lined with summer cabins in Fox Point, the Nohl family purchased a small cottage. In 1943, the small home became their full-time residence. In 1963, Mary Nohl began adorning the beachfront property both outside and inside with original artwork. This included concrete and wood sculptures in the yard, and attention to every surface in the home including paintings, hand-painted furniture, and more. As Nohl's creative output increased, a deep interest and appreciation of her remarkable artwork grew as she transformed her property into a unique art environment.

In 1996, Mary Nohl made a promised gift of her property and artwork to the Kohler Foundation, Inc., to fulfill her wish that her world be preserved after her death. Kohler Foundation, Inc. gifted the site to the John Michael Kohler Arts Center to steward Nohl's legacy moving forward. Although the site is closed to the public, JMKAC has been undertaking a long-term preservation and conservation project to maintain the property and artworks. Today, people interested in learning more can access 3,500 works of art by Mary Nohl at the Art Preserve.

Opened in June 2021, a few miles from Sheboygan's John Michael Kohler Arts Center, the Art Preserve is the first and only museum dedicated to artist-built environments, and includes 80% of Mary Nohl's creations. Visitors will discover her tools, paintings, jewelry, and sculptures on exhibit year round. JMKAC celebrates its partnership with the Fox Point Bayside School District, where they are collaborating on Nohl related programming. This includes bringing Mary Nohl's artwork into the schools, hosting students at the Art Preserve, and developing projects and curriculum utilizing Nohl's story to focus on creative thinking and problem solving. The Art Preserve offers free admission and parking.
