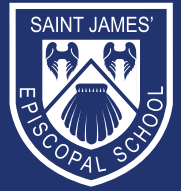

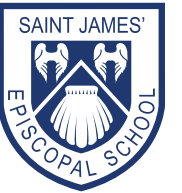

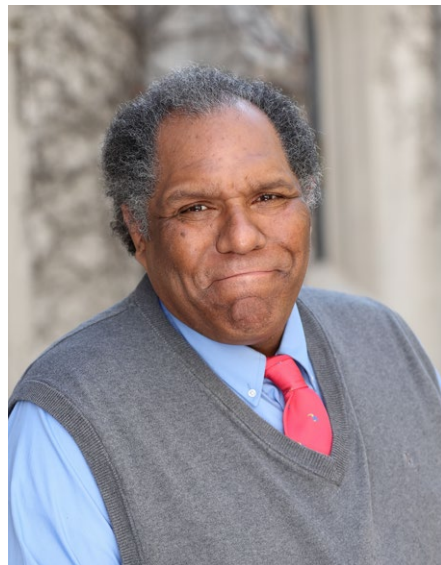

A Letter from the

Head of School

FROM PETER REINKE

Dear Families,

We were truly blessed last year with an amazingly generous response from our community to support St. James' philanthropically. Just recently, I hosted 10-12 Los Angeles school heads for dinner in our Center for Belonging. The heads were so impressed with this space where students can check in about their feelings, participate in different student activities and engage in thoughtful curriculum around feelings. This beautiful center would not have been possible without your generosity and I was tremendously proud to share the space with these other school heads.

I shared with the heads how grateful I am to all of you—the smallest and most vital school of all—the family—for your partnership in continuing to position St. James' as one of the strongest preschool and elementary programs in Los Angeles; your generosity allowed us to considerably expand our socio-emotional and DEIJB work, while also continuing to expand a robust academic curriculum.

As you know, over the last few years, we've added twelve new lead or associate teachers while continuing to lower teacher:student ratios, expanded our field study budget by almost \$200,000, added two new senior administrators to curate faculty engagement and professional development and to expand our socio-emotional work with students. All of these exciting refinements to our school would not have been possible without the consistently generous and engaged support of our families.

Your generosity allowed us to considerably expand our socio-emotional and DEIJB work, while also continuing to expand a robust academic curriculum.



While most independent schools have middling engagement from their parent body for philanthropy, St. James' soars at 100% and we raise significantly more per family than our national peer schools. Last year was no exception, with a historic annual fund at over 1.3 million dollars and a record-breaking gala, netting almost \$335,000 for St. James', with a particular focus on Beyond School and our exciting new performing arts program.

On behalf of our beloved staff and students, thank you for your generosity of spirit to this very special school.

President of the Board of Trustees

FROM RICH CHISHOLM

Dear Families,

I am very proud of how the St. James' community weathered the pandemic but certainly happy to turn the page to normalcy. This is my third year as President of the Board of Trustees and the first one that truly feels "normal." We have parents serving hot lunch. Kids playing with their smiles and laughs unobstructed by masks. No temperature checks.

In fact, we did not just weather the pandemic but we thrived in the last year including some of these highlights:

- We had a record fundraising year including \$1,300,000 for the Every Child Fund campaign and almost \$335,000 for the annual gala. These are fantastic numbers. I have been around long enough to remember being proud of numbers that were half of these amounts.
- We had fantastic matriculation success for our sixth graders last year. Every girl that applied to Marlborough was admitted. That may be a first for St. James'. And we had terrific success with matriculation at Harvard Westlake, Campbell Hall and the myriad of other terrific schools in Los Angeles — and Honolulu as well. As someone who has now placed two children out of St. James', I would like to tell all of you that it's going to work out great. Your children are prepared for the next step and they will find the right school. But that advice may fall on deaf ears and that is ok as well!

To be able to expand our footprint in a dense city like Los Angeles will forever change the trajectory of the school.

One of my proudest accomplishments as President of the Board of Trustees is what an amazing group of trustees we have put together. The school is in great hands. She is lifelong Angeleno, a very successful businessperson, and an alum of St. James' and Harvard-Westlake. She has three children who are 5 and under, and naturally, the two oldest already attend St. James'; the one-year old can't wait to join his siblings, too! She and her family have a nearly 40-year relationship with St. James', and Caroline looks forward to helping shepherd our school's growth and stellar reputation to even greater heights.

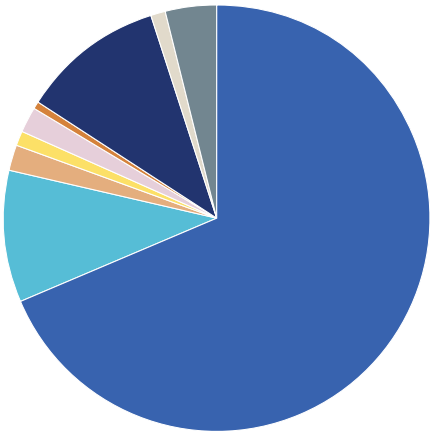

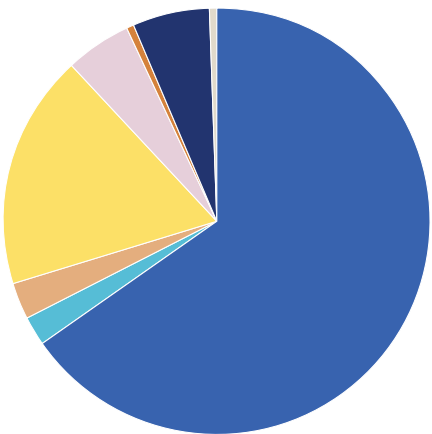

2021-22 was an historic year for The Every Child Fund at St. James’ with over \$1,300,000 raised. Not only did we raise a record amount, but we also achieved 100% family participation which is a testament to the partnership that St. James’ enjoys from its uniquely special community.

SCHOOL WIDE IMPROVEMENTS

The Every Child Fund is an essential part of the school’s operating budget and the funds raised were immediately put to use through investment in a new field and black top, new kiln for the art program, and new Center for Belonging which is an invaluable space that students enjoy on a daily basis as well a new coat of paint school wide. The preschool has new flooring throughout and new banners at the front of school. Most importantly, the funds allowed St. James’ to hire additional teaching staff leading to student teacher ratios of 5:1 in Dolphins and Butterflies, 7:1 in KRP and Kindergarten and 11:1 in 1st-6th grades. New landscaping is underway at the front of the elementary school and plans for fresh paint and new landscaping are in the works for preschool.

In addition to all of these recent enhancements to St. James’, The Every Child Fund continues to help fund our generous Tuition Assistance Program which supports approximately 20% of our families and is a vital part of our mission to provide an excellent education to a socioeconomically diverse group of families.

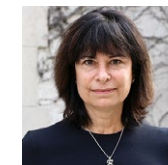

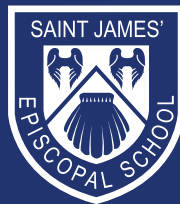
