## GIRLS BASKETBALL RALLIES FOR WIN OVER RICHMOND; BOYS SWIM GETS WIN OVER SWARTZ CREEK

### STRONG SECOND HALF LEADS NOTRE DAME PAST RICHMOND

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Basketball team earned a 41-29 home win over Richmond. The Irish trailed 18-16 at halftime but used a strong third quarter to take a 30-26 lead before outscoring the Blue Devils 11-3 in the fourth quarter to seal the win. The balanced offensive effort was led by Jazelle Yaldo with nine points. Ellie Whalen and Siena Apsey both finished with seven points while Emily Szalach and Sydney Burke each had five.

### GIRLS, BOYS SKI TEAMS TAKE GS VICTORIES

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Ski team earned head-to-head Giant Slalom wins over Detroit Country Day and Stoney Creek. Sydney Schulte placed first overall with Claire Kirchner taking third, Maren Studt placing eighth, and Amanda Roth finishing 11th. The Boys Varsity Ski team also earned Giant Slalom head-to-head wins over Berkley-Troy Athens, Detroit Country Day and Stoney Creek. Nick Uhaize led the way with a second place finish while Teegan McLeod (third), Chase Flavin (fourth) and CJ Studt 10th also contributed to the scoring effort.

### IRISH DROP ROAD CONTEST TO COLTS

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team dropped a road game at Troy 68-54. The Irish trailed by 10 following the opening quarter and faced a 41-28 deficit at halftime.

Notre Dame outscored Troy 17-12 in the third quarter to draw within eight points but were unable to get closer. Wade Robinson had 19 points to lead all Irish scorers with Jacob Tuttle adding 17 and Joey DeCasas finishing with 11.

### IRISH DROP BACK-AND-FORTH CONTEST TO LAKE SHORE

### BOYS SWIM GRABS WIN OVER SWARTZ CREEK

Second place finishes were earned by Edziu Lis in the 50 Free and 100 Free, and third place finishes came from Hunter Pugliese in the 200 IM, Aaron Hall in the 50 Free, Lucas Marchese in the 100 Fly, and Oliver Kayi in the 100 Breaststroke. The 200 IM and 400 Free Relays were also winners, and the 200 Free finished in second by only .06 seconds.
