

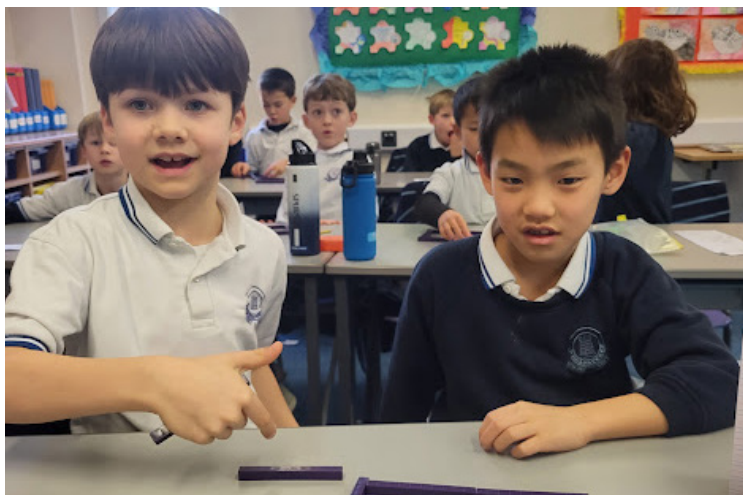


Maths Week

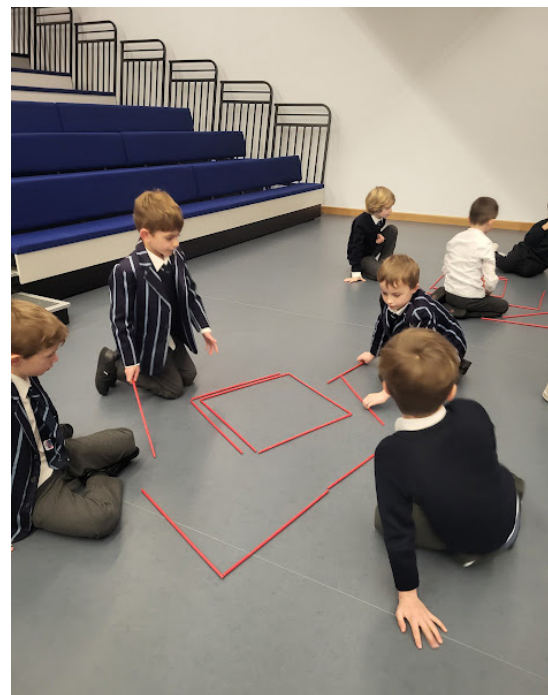
ISSUE

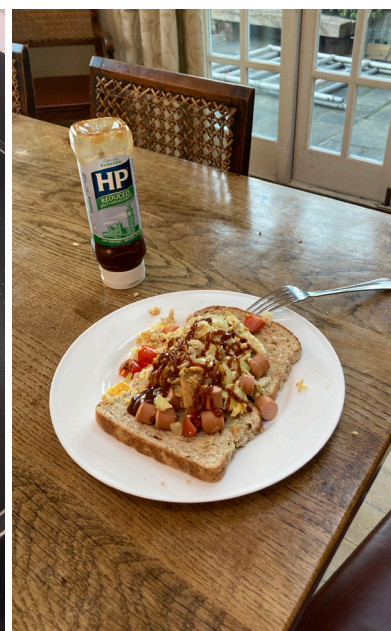
