SHS's Andie Giraso Makes Us All Proud!

On Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, SHS Junior, Andie Giraso, was one of eight community leaders, and the only youth representative, to participate in *Committed to Listen, a public reading of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s "Letter from a Birmingham Jail,"* co-hosted by The BTS Center and the Maine Council of Churches. We are so proud to have these incredible change-makers in our midst. Andie's road is hard-fought and many experiences at SHS have contributed to her social justice path. Not only has she been involved in Civil Rights Club and the RSVP (Reducing Sexism and Violence Program) since her freshman year, but she has also been a member of the district's DEI (Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion) committee since last year. Andie Giraso, 16, is a junior at Scarborough High School and the president of the civil rights club there.


She was born and raised in Rwanda and moved to Maine six years ago.

- We know through painful experience that freedom is never voluntarily given by the oppressor; it must be demanded by the oppressed. Frankly, I have yet to engage in a direct action campaign that was "well timed" in the view of those who have not suffered unduly from the disease of segregation. - Dr. MLK, Jr.

Giraso said, "Growing up, racism wasn't something that ever crossed my mind. I was constantly surrounded with people who looked like me and sounded like me. It wasn't until I stepped foot in America that I witnessed the racial injustice that torments our people.

"It's very important that we acknowledge the existence of racism in today's society rather than ignoring it and pretending it no longer exists. That is why I choose to speak out for those who are silenced in my community, and I hope to continue this work after graduating high school.

"I first read Dr. King's 'Letter from Birmingham Jail' during my freshman year of high school. My initial reaction to the letter was hope. It gave me hope knowing that Dr. King was able to do what he did, especially during a time where racism and segregation was so normalized. It gave me the confidence to believe that we (this generation) can and will make a change. What stood out to me the most was him saying, 'freedom is never voluntarily given by the oppressor; it must be demanded by the oppressed.' Meaning that if we want change, we must demand it."


What is Alternative Education?

Alternative Education (Alt Ed) allows students who are struggling to succeed in traditional, mainstream classes to access their education in a more individualized way. The Alt Ed program at SHS is located within the high school and addresses the individual academic, social, and behavioral needs of students at risk of dropping out of school. Classes in the program involve small groups, participation-based grading, and a focus on social/emotional needs. While most core courses and many elective courses are offered through Alt Ed, students are welcomed and encouraged to take any other courses offered at and through SHS, including vocational offerings, at any time. Alt Ed students earn the same diploma as other students at SHS!

SHS's Alternative Education program serves up to 22 students in grades 10-12. Alt Ed is a program of choice--all students who are in the program are enrolled because they have chosen it. This program is open to students who receive IEP or 504 services, but it is not a special education program and is open

to all students at SHS. The program staffs two full-time teachers, one focusing on math and science and the other specializing in English and social studies. Currently, we still have a few openings for new students looking to start Semester 2.

If you are interested in learning more about Alt Ed, especially if this sounds like a program that would help your student, please contact your student's administrator (Mr. Brown or Mr. Theriault), your student's guidance counselor, or any of the school's social workers.

Gold and Silver Key artwork will be featured in an upcoming exhibition at Maine College of Art & Design. Please join us in congratulating our students on their incredible work!





Clinic Notes

IMMUNIZATIONS: Immunization requirements for students attending public schools have changed in recent years. In addition to the vaccines required for kindergarten entry, both a Tdap vaccine and one dose of MCV4 are required for all students entering 7th grade. Two doses of MCV4 are required for students entering 12th grade. If the first dose of MCV4 was administered on or after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required. All students in grades K-12 need two doses of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine for school entry. Please send updated immunization records to the clinic whenever your student receives a required vaccine.

MEDICATIONS: Students may not transport, carry, or self-administer prescription or non-prescription medication at school, with the exception of rescue inhalers, EpiPens, and certain other emergency medications. All medications administered at school require a new physician's order and written parental permission each year. Updated orders must also be on file for emergency medications that students may be carrying. Physician orders may be faxed directly to the clinic at 730-5196.


The clinic stocks Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen which may be administered to students as needed with parental permission. If you have not already done so this year, please complete online permission through the PowerSchool Parent Portal.

HEALTH: Please contact the clinic staff if your child has a health issue (acute or chronic) or sustains a physical injury that may require accommodations while at school.

ILLNESS: Students who have symptoms of respiratory or gastrointestinal infections, such as cough, fever, sore throat, vomiting, or diarrhea, should stay home. Students needs to be free from fever, vomiting, and diarrhea for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication before returning to school. **COVID testing is recommended** for individuals with symptoms of COVID prior to their return to school. If your student tests positive for COVID: If a student develops symptoms and tests positive for COVID, they must stay at home regardless of vaccination status. They should remain home for a full 5 days from the onset of symptoms or date of positive test. If their symptoms are improving, they may return to school on day 6, and they must wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days upon their return.


If your student is exposed to COVID, but does not have any symptoms: As long as your student does not have any symptoms and is testing negative, they may attend school. It is recommended that the student mask for 10 days following their exposure and remain home if they develop symptoms. The CDC removed the recommendation for close contacts to quarantine, unless they are symptomatic.
