RCHS Procedures

- Main Doors open at 8:30am for students – Students that arrive early will have to wait outside of the school building until opening time indicated. All students must enter the building with a mask. Students that are not eating breakfast will report directly to the auditorium for our daily morning meeting. Students that are eating breakfast will report to the cafeteria.
- RPS has been at the medium or low CDC community level since the beginning of September. Therefore, the updated guidance for COVID-19 makes masks optional for all students and staff both indoors and outdoors.
- All students will eat lunch together this year. Lunch will take place after 2nd period classes. Lunch times will vary based on the bell schedule of the day. We have three primary bell schedules (Regular, Activity, and Family/Club), which you can find on our website: rchs.rvaschools.net/about-us/bell-schedule
- All students must use the sign in/out system when leaving their classroom after receiving permission from their teacher. This is standard practice for our school culture.
- We will implement our 10/10 rule, which indicates no movement in the building during the first ten minutes and last ten minutes of class, unless it's an emergency.

Junior Class Families,

I'm writing on behalf of the Junior Class Team to share some information about minimester. This year, the junior class will travel to Lancaster & Philadelphia, PA from May 15-19. We are planning to visit many historical & cultural sites, tour colleges, participate in some team-building activities, and have fun coming together as a class. Minimester is a unique Community experience and we are so excited to bring it back. We should have received an informational letter with details.

****Sophomore minimester.**

This year, we are excited to take our sophomores to Atlanta, Georgia, to explore civil and human rights. The city of Atlanta is rich with cultural and historical attractions that will lend to the development of our mission. Atlanta played an essential role in the Civil War and the Civil Rights movement. While there, our sophomore students will examine the Holocaust and other examples of genocide in the twentieth century and synthesize evidence from artifacts and primary and secondary sources to obtain information about events and life in world history.

Attractions like the Michael C. Carlos Museum, Center for Civil and Human Rights, Apex Museum, Museum of History and Holocaust Education, and the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historic Site will all serve to inform our students of the rich history of the state of Georgia and how that history has impacted our lives today.

In addition to the cultural aspects of the trip, students will tour the campuses of several area colleges. This will allow them to speak directly with admission officers and get a feel for campus life.

Arrival/Dismissal

Below is a very important message from our Safety & Security Department after evaluating our dismissal and traffic process. Please adhere to these guidelines. Parent pickup and drop-off is at the front of the building on E. Brookland Park Blvd. Students and parents should be using the crosswalks at each corner to safely cross the street. Mid-block crossing is dangerous, and visibility is limited. Drivers should follow traffic laws at all times. To avoid traffic collisions, no U-turns should be done in the middle of the street. We want all students and their families to arrive and depart safely at all times.

Please avoid using Woodrow Ave if possible, as this street is used for bus arrival and dismissal. If you have to use Woodrow Ave. when buses are loading and unloading, **vehicles are to remain stopped while the stop sign is out and flashing red.** (<https://law.lis.virginia.gov/vacode/46.2-859>) There is a fine of \$250 for violations of passing a stopped school bus.
