The conference consists of a series of multiple virtual events on multiple days throughout June-August 2023. If an admitted student cannot attend parts of the programming live, there will be asynchronous options for students to watch the content they miss. The conference registration fee for admitted students is \$99; if the fee places a significant financial burden on a student's family, financial assistance is available as they do not want the fee to be a barrier for any deserving student.
