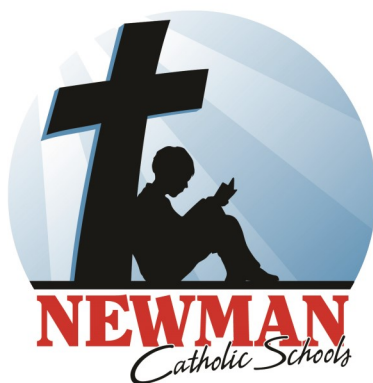

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

Seniors are reminded to continue/finish applying to the college(s) of their choice. All transcripts must be requested by the student via [Parchment](#). Continue to keep grades up, as colleges to which you have sent transcripts may require updated grades at semester and will definitely require a final transcript at the end of the year.

SCHOLARSHIPS are being updated regularly and it is the student's responsibility to check the Newman website and watch for text reminders. **Please notify Student Services of all scholarships awarded from colleges or other organizations, so students may be properly recognized at the Senior Awards Ceremony.** Applications for scholarships whose winners are selected by the Newman Scholarship & Awards Committee were distributed and explained to senior students in mid-December. Applications must be typed and submitted to Mrs. Wulf by Tuesday, January 31.

COLLEGE VISITS

Juniors should begin/continue touring colleges and universities throughout their junior year.. Students have been assigned essays reflecting on each of the three **required** college visits which must be submitted to their English teacher in May.

CAREER

Juniors had class guidance with Mrs. Wulf in December--the focus of which was lifestyle values and how it should guide career exploration. Students have unlimited access to Xello and are encouraged to use our career exploration resources as often as they can.

ACT

Juniors who registered in December/early January will take the *ACT with WRITING* at NCHS during the school day on March 7, 2023. 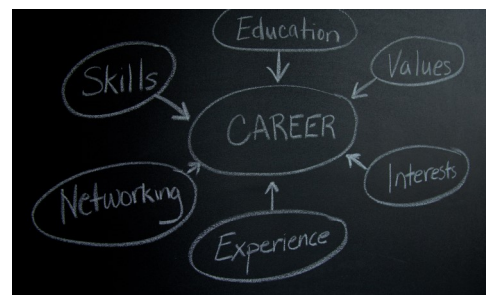

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Parents of eighth grade students (“future freshmen”) are invited to an open house meeting for Newman Catholic High School on January 19 at 6:30 pm. Parents will learn more about the Newman high school experience and have an opportunity to ask questions.

All middle school classes participated in a guidance lesson for second quarter. Eighth grade student had one guidance lesson focused on the high school experience, including Q&A with a panel of 9th and 10th grade students. All grades (6 through 8) had a guidance lesson on the dangers of drugs and alcohol and how to find your natural “high”. Middle school is a critical time for parents to have a conversation with their children about drugs and alcohol. 7th Grade Science

In 7th grade science we have been learning about the elements that make up our world. We are currently looking at what happens when chemicals react with one another and the differences between physical and chemical changes. Next week we will start a lab to use what we have learned to become detectives and solve a classic “whodunit” case. After wrapping up our lab, we will learn about acids and bases to end our unit. Coming up in February we will begin a new unit on Geology and Plate Tectonics.

8th Grade Science

In 8th grade science, students have just begun a new unit that will serve as an introduction to Chemistry. We have looked at the Periodic Table and what elements make up the world around us. We are currently learning about bonds formed between atoms and will start chemical reactions soon. A big focus towards the end of this unit will be learning about different equipment used in chemistry labs, what they are used for, and how they are used.

8th Grade Social Studies

8th grade Civics students are in the process of learning about the branches of the federal government. Currently, we are learning about the roles and responsibilities of a President. They have used their digital design skills to create some hiring ads for the position. We will be learning about other executive agencies and wrap our unit up with Presidential reports toward the end of the month. Our next unit will cover the Judicial Branch.

Mr. Beck

6th Grade English

In addition to students’ writing, working on spelling, and proper grammar usage, we have also been focused on reading comprehension this month. The students read a story called Scout’s Honor from the class reader. This story relayed information about a popular youth organization, but from the 1940’s. It gave the students a chance to see what life was like for some younger people during this timeframe, the responsibilities that were expected of them, and how people survived without things like cell phones. We are currently reading *Bridge to Terabithia*. This is a Newbery Award winning book that discusses themes such as imagination, understanding and loss.

7th Grade English

Students are working on reading comprehension with the book *Where The Red Fern Grows*.

This Classic Newbery book has many themes and is intended to teach students hard work, compassion, and loyalty. We will end this unit with a research paper of their choice connected to this reading, while learning how to use MLA formatting to cite their sources.

8th Grade English

The class worked on creating their own personal calendars for 2023. Currently, we are working on debates in class. At this level, students are engaged in organization of ideas, being able to give affirmative points about an issue, and also give counter-arguments using research and evidence. We will finish out the month by reading the Newbery book, *The Giver*. This book gives many students an introduction to the genre of dystopian fictional literature. Topics addressed will include: memory, human life, rules and control.

Newman Middle School News

Mr. Gress 6th Grade Math

In Math, the students just completed a chapter that involves one variable equations and inequalities. They learned to write and solve equations and inequalities using the four basic operations. We are currently covering factors and multiples practicing prime factorization, finding the greatest common factor, and calculating the least common multiple.

6th Grade Science

In Science we are learning about force and everything associated with it such as speed, velocity, acceleration, and momentum. Next, the students will learn about Newton's three laws of motion including such concepts as friction, air resistance, balanced and unbalanced forces, gravity, and weight and mass.

8th Grade Math

The students have finalized learning about fractions and mixed numbers using the four basic operations as well as some geometric foundations that included circumference of circles and area of triangles and trapezoids. We are now studying how to estimate and find square roots, reviewing the real number system, learning about the Pythagorean Theorem and special right triangles, and further advancing our understanding of distance on the coordinate plane.

Mrs. Bergmann 6th Grade Spanish

The sixth grade has just begun a new unit on interrogatives including "the question word song" and how to write good sentences in Spanish! We will also be reviewing vocabulary for colors, shapes, weather, and seasons.

7th Grade Spanish

In seventh grade, the students are working on a food unit which includes several fun projects such as writing about favorite meals, creating a menu, and a restaurant skit. Our verb conjugation tasks continue with present tense -er and -ir verbs.

8th Grade Spanish

Eighth grade is working on a unit in which they learn vocabulary for places in the community, types of transportation, and local services. There is a lot of both present and past tense work on verbs in this unit.



Seventh and Eighth Grade News

Mrs. Hebert-Immel 7th Grade and 8th Grade Computers-Independent Lab-Digital Citizenship

We are finishing up the digital citizenship unit. Both grades made a poster on digital citizenship. Some posters focused on cyberbullying while others focused on other topics such as being safe online and what it means to be a good digital citizen. The posters were put up on the wall for everyone to see. The students did an awesome job displaying their creativity and understanding in their efforts in completing this project. Now during the last week before the end of the semester the 7th graders are completing a slideshow on

cyberbullying and the 8th graders are completing a cyberbullying collaboration slideshow. The 8th graders created a survey and gathered information concerning cyberbullying which they are presenting in their slideshow.

Weather Related School Closing Procedures



Newman Catholic Schools *Weather Related School Closing Procedures*

When considering schedule changes due to inclement weather, Newman Catholic Schools (NCS) continues to take its lead from the Wausau School District (WSD) and D.C. Everest School District (DCE). Each district varies in its standards and definitions of closure. These differences can cause confusion as NCS crosses both districts. To assist in alleviating this potential confusion, a school-by-school breakdown of procedures is laid out below. Any changes to these procedures will be communicated through Constant Contact, school newsletters, etc. Be sure to read **ALL** announcements and updates to avoid missing information.

The following tools will be the standard of communication used to announce schedule changes due to inclement weather:

- **Constant Contact:** Will be sent to the parents directly affected by the schedule changes.
- **Facebook:** Visit the Newman Catholic Schools page.
- **NCS Website:** A pop-up notification will appear upon entering www.newmancatholicschools.com.
- **TV Stations:** Channel 9 (www.waow.com) and Channel 7 (www.wsaw.com)
- **Midwest Communications Radio:** 95.5 WIFC, 101.9 WDEZ, Rock 94.7, 550AM WSAU, 1390AM Fox Sports
- **Skylert Messaging:** Digital messaging sent via email, phone, and text. You can manage your Skylert Messaging through your Skyward Family Access account. **Skylert may not be the fastest method for last minute changes. Please refer to the other communication tools first.*

Delays: The definition of delay varies by district.

- **Wausau School District–Bus Delays** – This only affects students who are picked up by First Student. Students bused by First Student will be picked up based on the delayed time. Classes at NCES: St. Anne and Newman Catholic Middle/High School will continue to run on their normal schedule. Students that are dropped off, walk, or ride the city bus are expected to be at school at the regularly scheduled time. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes at NCECC: St. Michael will be cancelled when busing is delayed. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Anne and NCECC: St. Michael will run as regularly scheduled.
- **D.C. Everest School District–School Delays** – This affects all students at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark, and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at both NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese. Unless specified differently, child care programs at NCES: St. Mark and NCECC: St. Therese will run as regularly scheduled.

This also affects NCMS/HS students who reside in DCE and are picked up by Lamers. Busing will be delayed by two hours. Classes at NCMS/HS will continue to run on their normal schedule. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.

School-by-School Procedures:

Newman Catholic Middle and High School (NCMS/HS)

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCMS/HS follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays. At times, the two public school districts do not align in their decisions to close early or at the same time; for example:
 - DCE closes early but WSD does not; this will affect DCE bused students only. In this case, parents of DCE bused students will be contacted letting them know when busses will arrive for pick-up. If parents wish for students to remain the entire day, they must arrange for transportation at the end of the day and notify the school.
 - WSD closes early but DCE does not; all students must be picked up by the stated release time. If a student who is bused from DCE does not have alternative transportation other than the bus home, parents should contact the office to discuss arrangements.
- **Closing** – NCMS/HS follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.

Weather Related School Closing Procedures

NCES: St. Anne

- **Delayed Starts** – Delays only affect students riding a yellow school bus. Classes will continue to run on the normal schedule for all other students. Delayed busing is considered an excused absence. Parents can choose to drop their students off to avoid delays.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to the WSD early release schedule included in this document. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Anne follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Before and After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, before and after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

NCES: St. Mark

- **Delayed Starts** – Classes at NCES: St. Mark will be delayed by two hours, following DCE. Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCES: St. Mark.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCES: St. Mark follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCES: St. Mark follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements. In the event that the WSD closes and DCE does not close, NCES: St. Mark's Three-year-old Preschool and Kindergarten-5th grade classes will be canceled for the day.
- **Wrap-Around and Before & After Care** – In the event that there is a delayed start, before care will still be available. In the event that there is an early release, after care will not be available. Additionally, if there is a closing, wrap-around and before & after care will not be available. At times, when inclement weather is anticipated in the evening, after school activities are canceled, and we ask that you please pick up your child from after care as soon as possible, prior to the 5:30pm closing time.

NCECC: St. Michael

- **Delayed Starts** – Three-year-old Preschool and 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Michael.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Michael follows the WSD "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.

NCECC: St. Therese

- **Delayed Starts** – 4K AM/PM classes will be cancelled at NCECC: St. Therese.
- **Early Release** – When closing early, NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows DCE. All students must be picked up by the stated release time. Bused students will be picked up according to DCE's announcement, which will be determined on the day of the early release. Pick-up times are flexible during travel delays.
- **Closing** – NCECC: St. Therese's 4K AM/PM classes follows the DCE "Public and Private" closing announcements.
- **Licensed Child Care** – Delayed starts, early releases or closures may occur to ensure the safety of students, families and employees. In these rare instances, site directors will make the best decision for the safety of all, and families will be notified directly or using the standard of communication tools.
