

#### KCS Head of Senior School Update

Exciting new Learning Partners, a four-day winter camping trip, new courses and clubs, and steady construction progress are among the highlights since the previous <u>Stories from the Journey</u> shared in December. Personal highlights also include the many meetings and interviews I've had with prospective parents and students. #### Learning Partnerships with The Boulevard Club and the Argonaut Rowing Club (ARC)

We are nearing the completion of an Agreement with <u>The Boulevard</u> <u>Club</u> that will allow us access to their athletic facilities. More details will follow as soon as they are finalized.


Likewise, we are excited to announce that we have a Learning Partnership with ARC and are finalizing the written agreement that will allow a P.E. offering from grades 9 to 12 with two year-long options: one P.E. course that will offer a variety of fitness and skill development options, and another option that will focus primarily on rowing. Students choosing the rowing option will help us build our varsity rowing team with training taking place during the school day as part of gym class. A dedicated, certified rowing coach, hired by ARC, will join the KCS P.E. teacher to deliver this unique athletic offering.

#### A Dedicated KCS Bus



#### **KCS PATH PROGRAM UPDATES**

#### Each Wednesday afternoon includes dedicated time where students assume a lead role in their learning.


The program, spanning grades 9 to 12, will see students learning about their area of greatest interest from multiple perspectives as well as through an offsite learning experience, each year up to at least grade 11. This learning can connect to school assignments, when relevant.

Thanks to Path and our students' initiative, it's a pleasure to have the following as added areas of learning at our school:

- Design
- Dance
- Filmmaking
- Flight
- Technology
- Video game creation
- Visual art

As part of Path, two students are actively working to create a video game that will help in the upcoming launch of a significant (and as yet secret!) KCS project. Another student is applying recent learning in graphic design to create a soon-to-bepublished document on our KCS By Design Program. Other studentdriven initiatives include making a video tribute to athletics, a painting of a family tartan, and more. The student who chose filmmaking even stepped in to make our grade 9 contribution to the KCS Christmas showcase.





#### **KCS BY DESIGN**

Following the <u>KCS</u> <u>design thinking process</u>, our grade 9 students have chosen water pollution as an area of the school experience they want to build.

They've learned about the challenges posed by stormwater runoff, e-coli, plastics, garbage, and other sources of toxins that threaten all lives that depend on clean water. Our December report shared multiple steps that had already been taken. The following new initiatives are in the preparation stages:

One group is organizing a beach clean-up at Humber Bay Park West in May. We look forward to working with Learning Partner <u>A Greener Future</u> and some of our Junior School students to expand our community's commitment to freshwater stewardship.

A second group of students chose to focus on raising awareness at our Junior School and beyond. They're creating a presentation for a future school assembly as well as social media posts we can share in our various channels.
