### **Goal #1:** Promote growth and achievement in the Dunlap School Community.

#### Celebrating Student Growth in the Classroom...

Student growth and achievement can be found in all corners of Dunlap Schools. During the 2022-2023 school year, Dunlap Middle School earned a summative designation of "Exemplary" by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE).

The summative designation is issued by ISBE each year and takes into account various factors including "Academic Indicators", "School Quality", and "Student Success Indicators". This designation also means that Dunlap Middle School's overall performance was in the top 10% of all schools. Congratulations to Dunlap Middle School staff, students, and families!

Hickory Grove Elementary School and Ridgeview Elementary School have been recognized by the U.S. Department of Education as 2022 National Blue Ribbon Schools. This distinction was awarded to 17 schools in Illinois out of only 297 schools across the nation. Both schools were nominated by the Illinois State Board of Education under the category of exemplary high-performing schools. It is truly a special occasion having two schools from Dunlap recognized at the national level. The awards were presented to each school at a ceremony in Washington D.C. on November 3rd & 4th.

Congratulations to the Hickory Grove and Ridgeview students, teachers, families, and administrators.





### **Goal #1:** Promote growth and achievement in the Dunlap School Community.

#### Celebrating Student Growth in the Classroom...

In October, the Illinois State Board of Education released schools' summative designations on the 2022 Illinois Report Card. The summative designation describes how well an individual school is meeting the needs of all its students. Dunlap High School received "Exemplary," which is the highest possible designation! In order to be "exemplary," a school must be in the top 10 percent of all schools, must have no underperforming student groups and must have a graduation rate higher than 67 percent. Congratulations to the students, staff and families of the Dunlap High School community!



We continue to be proud of our students' growth and high academic performance, especially in light of the challenges we all have faced over the past couple of years. We appreciate the hard work of our dedicated staff and the support of our Dunlap High School families.



Several members of the administrative team attended the Illinois Principals Fall Leadership Conference in October. During this time, the "Leaders of Hope" attended professional learning workshops and keynote sessions, networked with over 700 other leaders from across the state of Illinois, and spent time learning from each other.

# **Goal #2**: Manage resources in a responsible, efficient, and effective manner.

The 2022-23 School Year is off to a great start! This year, the Curriculum Department is facilitating two literacy initiatives at the elementary level: a pilot of the *Wit and Wisdom* English language arts curriculum resources and LETRS Training through the Lexia Corporation. As we continue to monitor and evaluate existing curriculum programming and resources across the district, the desire for new materials was clearly part of the ESSER-III Funds Stakeholder Survey results that were administered last fall. In our effort to be good stewards of the taxpayer-funded grant funds, the Department has gone through a methodical process of evaluating all potential resources to be used as the backbone of literacy instruction at the elementary level.

Over 20 educators have signed up for the extensive two-year LETRS Training that focuses on the essential components of reading instruction--phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, writing, and language skills. Both the ELA pilot and LETRS Training are focused on the "Science of Reading" research that recognizes the unique ways in which the human brain learns language--be it spoken, read, or written. Empowering our teachers and building their capacity to meet all students' needs will help build collective teacher efficacy which has the highest impact on student growth and achievement.

These first two initiatives are part of the Elementary ELA Resource Adoption Plan that spans three years. A final major component of the plan includes an Early Childhood Education Coordination (ECE) Committee that is charged with creating a vision for ECE in Dunlap School District. This vision and the belief statements will be used similarly to the ELA Instruction Vision statements created last year while evaluating resources and helping to determine what curriculum resources and professional development is needed to ensure we provide developmentally appropriate ways for students to learn all facets of the ECE curriculum. The committee convened its first meeting on Thursday, November 10, and has future dates on the calendar to continue this coordinated effort to help our youngest learners.

At the middle-school level, the Curriculum Council put the finishing touches on the Curriculum Department Three-Year Plan which is focused not only on completing our Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum (GVC) work to ensure that learning is consistent among our middle schools to allow for professional dialogue about the agreed-upon learning expectations but also to ensure objectives are transparent and accessible to all students. The Dunlap High School Instructional Leadership Team will be completing the same shortly. At the November 11th SIP afternoon, middle-school teachers completed the Curriculum Evaluation Tool to evaluate curricular programming at the middle-level; the high school will follow at the March Teacher Institute Day. The results of the survey will be used to place whole-group and department-level professional development needs to ensure that, like our elementary teachers, they, too, are given up-to-date professional learning opportunities to help meet the needs of all students, in all subject areas.

The Curriculum Department is devoted to empowering all our students to reach their individual potential and is forever thankful for the strong partnership with our families that makes this effort possible.

# **Goal #3:** Provide a challenging and positive learning environment in the pursuit of excellence.

Wilder-Waite Grade School welcomed 30 veterans on Veterans Day at a school-wide assembly to honor our past and present veterans. Dunlap Mayor Jack Esterdahl opened the event with remarks about the gift of freedom and sacrifice. Mr. Bruce Stewart, a Korean War Veteran, followed and shared a personal story and poem reading. Boy Scout Pack #254 led the Presentation of Colors. A huge highlight was the Dunlap High School Band and Color Guard who performed the United States Military Medley to individually recognize each branch and the veterans in attendance. Over 75 veterans' names were read to honor our Wildcats' family members. During the weeks leading up to the assembly, a "Wall of Honor" was created with photos and stories of each veteran. There were also artifacts on display for a "living museum." 4th and 5th Grade Essay/Poem winners shared "What Freedom Means to Me". To conclude, the entire 5th Grade Project Impact led the singing and signing of "America the Beautiful." We are extremely thankful for all of the veterans who traveled and spent their morning with us. We are forever grateful for their service and appreciate the opportunity to make special connections within our Wildcat family.

Dunlap Grade School is thankful for the return of volunteers within our school community. Our school benefits from our volunteers in so many ways. Mrs. Luebbers conducts a weekly Harry Potter Club after school where fifth graders engage in learning activities related to Hogwarts! The Huntington Family spearheads a weekly running club for our older students that promotes healthy habits and engages other parent volunteers to run at DGS and on the Rock Island Trail. Long-time volunteer, Gladys Martin became a Royal VIP by coming back to donate an entire day each week to work with students in small groups on science and art activities to promote positive rapport and relationships! Our Parents Club Organization continues to plan events to support our staff and students. They have already hosted numerous staff luncheons, a scholastic book fair and neon Royal Ball and dance. It truly takes a community to do the work we do at DGS and we're thankful for all our volunteers!






# **Goal #3:** Provide a challenging and positive learning environment in the pursuit of excellence.

### Pathways Program Partnerships

The Pathways Transition Program at DHS has been busy taking on new adventures out in the community. Each week they learn about a different job and visit or interview a person in that job title.

Most recently, the Pathways group was able to visit the Dunlap Transportation Department to learn about car care. Ryan Bowald, our district's assistant mechanic demonstrated how to check tire pressure and change wiper blades. Brad Schoolman, the district's mechanic showed students the hydraulic lift and they were able to see the underbody of a vehicle.

Students also took a trip to Hooked on Fishing in East Peoria to learn the parts of a fishing rod, how to cast, and baiting a hook. What a great catch! Students visited Purple Panda Preschool to learn about what education and job skills are needed to be an Early Childhood teacher.

### **Students Thrive With Extracurriculars**


