AP and CE CREDITS

Concurrent Enrollement (CE)

College Class @ SHS

If you get a passing grade then you receive college credit. The grade goes on both your high school and college transcripts

Pay a one-time \$30.00 WSU admission fee then \$5 per credit (\$15 total for one semester class)

You MUST have a 3.0 cumulative GPA to take General Education classes

Withdrawing early gives you a "W" on your college transcript and may affect your ability to get financial aid

Advanced Placement (AP)

If you pass the AP test at the end of the year with a score of 3 or above you receive college credits on your transcript.

Pay \$96 for each test

Credits transfer to universities across the nation. The most competitive universities prefer AP scores over CE grades.



Certificate of Completion

- Certificate from Weber State University stating all General Education Requirements are fulfilled –
- Present this to any State University or College and General Education Requirements are waived, even it they are different. (Additional prerequisites may be required depending on degree)
- Approximately 37 college credits from both AP and CE Classes you can complete the requirements at SHS
- Note: An Associates Degree at a university requires 60 credits.

Step 1: Log onto your Student MyDSD account.






Step 2:

Select the "Academics" — option in the banner at the top of the screen.


Step 3:

Step 4:


Once you select "Course Request", you will land at the Course Request screen. To add a class, select the blue "+Add Course" option under column 1.

An "Add Course" window will appear. In the "Course" option, type in the name of the class you are wanting to add. A list of courses will appear. Select the class you are wanting to add.


Step 6:




Tips and Tricks:

- 2. Allow you to move the class to a different column (Semester 1 or 2, or alternatives).
- 3. Remove the course from your request.
