Andover Board of Education Notes Sept. 12, 2022

Good News: The Board recognized James Harris, speech and debate teacher/coach at Andover High School, for being inducted into the Kansas Speech Communications Association Hall of Fame.

BCC partnership: Dr. Kim Krull, president of Butler Community College, spoke to the Board to show appreciation for the strong partnerships between the district and BCC.

Summer school: Jill Lachenmayr, assistant superintendent for academic affairs, and several principals presented on <u>summer school experiences</u> provided through the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund.

Transportation update: Richard Bell, executive director of operations, <u>provided an update</u> on the district's transportation fleet, ridership and other highlights to begin the school year.

Enrollment and staffing: Jeremy Boldra, assistant superintendent for human resources, provided a preliminary report on <u>enrollment</u> and <u>staffing</u> for the fall. Non-virtual enrollment is down approximately 25 students compared to fall 2021. Enrollment figures will not be official until after Sept. 20, and then are audited in spring 2023.

Board position: The Board voted on a finalist pool to fill the vacancy left by Melinda Fritze's resignation. The finalists were selected from the candidates the Board interviewed during a special meeting earlier in the afternoon.
