Application Must Be Received by March 31, 2023

The HGCAA Youth Scholarship Program was created to promote goodwill between the Burglar and Fire Alarm Industry and first responders as part of our ongoing partnership with police, fire, and first aid officials. The program provides cash scholarship awards to their deserving sons or daughters who are attending a college, university, or trade school.

2023 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The winner is selected from the applicants and receives an award of up to \$2,500 to be used toward tuition at a college, university, or trade school. He or she will be a guest at the HGCAA meeting in Houston in May of 2023 for award presentation

The HGCAA will award THREE scholarships in 2023:
1st Place Winner \$2,500.00
2nd Place Winner \$1,500.00
3rd Place Winner \$1,000.00

Rules and Eligibility Requirements

The student must be at least 15 years of age and not older than 20. He or she must be a graduating senior (in the 2022 – 2023 school year) who will receive a diploma from an accredited high school, located within the state. He or she must be accepted for admission to an accredited college, university, or trade school in the fall of 2023.

Each eligible student must have a father, mother or legal guardian who is a full-time active-duty employee, and not on disability. The parent or guardian must be a member of a law enforcement agency, medical responder, or a full-time paid or volunteer member of a fire department located in the Gulf Coast region of the State of Texas who regularly works the frontline to keep our community safe.

Each student must submit a completed and signed application. Failure to follow instructions can result in disqualification.

Students must submit:

- Proof of enrollment in high school via an official transcript and SAT/ACT scores
- Proof of acceptance to a college or university, or trade school (letter acceptable)
- Proof of parent's occupation (ID or supervisory letter acceptable)
- Essay (typed) (Place name on each page)
- Letter of recommendation from counselor, teacher, or other agency regarding extracurricular activities

Awards are based on a combination of academic achievement, national test scores, extracurricular activities and the essay. All decisions are final. All materials become property of the HGCAA. Submission is permission to publish any and all essays.

Criteria for Awards

The HGCAA Youth Scholarship Program awards will be given based on the below noted criteria.

1. Grade Average	15 points
2. SAT/ACT Scores	5 points
3. Essay	60 points
4. Extracurricular activities	<u>20 points</u>
Total	100 points
