





HOW DOES NEW PROPERTY AFFECT REVENUE?

TIMING OF TAX LIEN DATE

- County Auditor values homes as of January 1 of each year
- Taxes are paid in the year following the tax lien date
- For a new home, the timing of construction completion can delay full tax receipts for up to 18 months

HOME VALUE AND TAXES GENERATED VS. COST TO EDUCATE STUDENTS

 Operational cost to educate one student in Olentangy was \$12,615 for the 2020-21 school year



EXAMPLE

- A home is finished in late August of 2022, but it was a vacant lot on January 1, 2022
- Therefore, taxes in 2023 will only be for the value of the land
- The home/structure will not be added to the tax duplicate via lien until January 1, 2023
- Homeowners will make their first tax payable on home/structure in 2024
