

## BCSD Middle School (6-8) Progressive Discipline Plan: Teacher Managed

### BEHAVIORAL MISCONDUCT: LEVEL I (CLASSROOM MANAGED/ TEACHER MANAGED)

Behavioral misconduct is defined as those activities engaged in by student(s) which tend to impede orderly classroom procedures or instructional activities, orderly operation of school, or the frequency or seriousness of which interrupt the classroom or school. The provisions of this regulation apply not only to within-school activities, but also to student conduct on the school bus transportation vehicles, or other school related vehicles, at official school bus stops, and during school-sponsored activities on or off school premises. The following offenses should be handled by the classroom teacher and are processed as minor incidents, not through a formal referral for disciplinary action from administration. These infractions should be documented by the teacher. Cases of multiple or chronic offenses may require administrative action/guidance assistance and a referral for interventions

**DISRUPTIVE CONDUCT: LEVEL II**

Disruptive conduct is defined as those activities engaged in by student(s) which are directed against persons or property, and the consequences of which tend to endanger the health or safety of oneself or others in the school. Some instances of disruptive conduct may overlap certain criminal offenses, justifying both administrative sanctions and court proceedings. Behavioral misconduct (Level I) may be reclassified as disruptive conduct (Level II) if it occurs three or more times. The provision of this regulation applies not only to within-school activities, but also to student conduct on school transportation vehicles, or other school related vehicles, at official school bus stops, and during school-sponsored activities on or off school premises.

**CRIMINAL CONDUCT: LEVEL III**

Criminal conduct is defined as those activities engaged in by student(s) which result in violence to oneself or another 's person or property or which pose a direct and serious threat to the safety of oneself or others in the school. When school officials have reasonable belief that students have engaged in such activities, then these activities usually require administrative actions which result in the immediate removal of the student from the school, the intervention of the School Resource Officer or other local Contact SRO/Local Law Enforcement Agency authorities, and/ or action by local the board. The provisions of this regulation apply not only to within-school activities, but also to student conduct on school transportation vehicles, or other school related vehicles, at official school bus stops, and during school-sponsored activities on or off school premises.
