

## <u>Belmont Hills Elementary School</u>

LMSD schools will celebrate Black History Month with a variety of educational and enrichment activities throughout February. African-American history is part of the year-long curriculum at all levels, but teachers and students will take extra time throughout the month for further exploration of significant historical figures and events. Displays throughout the schools will feature art, literature and general information reinforcing curricular learning while a variety of programs and classroom-specific activities will emphasize the significance of African-Americans throughout history.

Bulletin Boards:** Each staff member will be working with students to create posters with clues (and answers underneath) about an influential African-American who has overcome significant obstacles to achieve success. Throughout the month, each class will visit their fellow classmates' "Guess Who?" posters around the building to learn about the impact and contributions made by the selected figures.

BHM Trivia Mini Posters: This project will focus on young African-American activists who are making an impact in the world. The Bulldogs will learn about a new young person each day to demonstrate that you don't need to wait until you "grow up" to create positive change.

Famous African-Americans Assembly: First graders will collaborate to create and present a funfilled and educational assembly highlighting famous African-Americans throughout history. This year, the first grade students will be researching and presenting about influential musicians and singers.
