
All KIS teachers are qualified instructors with relevant teaching degrees, and over 50% hold a Master's or PhD degree in their field of instruction.

Just as our families and students hail from many nations, so do our teachers. They come from the US, the UK, Canada, Australia, Spain, France, Belgium, Thailand, China, India, New Zealand, and beyond.

Teachers at KIS work collaboratively to guide the students in their learning. Our faculty has ample opportunities for professional development, allowing all our students to benefit from up-to-date teaching practices and educational research.

Many of our faculty also have roles in the IB organization. Some of these include: teacher trainers, IB school accreditation visitors, and IB Diploma examiners. All of this allows KIS to be closely involved with the development and the direction of the IB Organization.

With over 800 students and a schoolwide teacher to student ratio of less than 1:8, our students are all known, understood, and respected as individuals, and the sense of community is strong.

THE EARLY YEARS

Imagine, investigate, and explore through play-based learning

Young children are natural inquirers. They love to explore and ask questions. The Early Years, which is part of the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP), builds on this natural curiosity, acknowledging that experiences during the early years lay the foundation for all future learning.

In addition to developing language skills and cognition, social and emotional skills evolve naturally in a play-based environment. Most importantly, this time of creativity and exploration sets the foundation for a positive attitude towards learning for the rest of their lives.











The dedicated and experienced teachers at KIS create stimulating learning spaces, listen deeply to students, and plan exciting opportunities for inquiry. The Early Years environment provides a welcoming and safe learning environment, both indoors and outdoors, where children learn through play. Academic and social learning are integrated, helping children achieve independence, self confidence, and a sense of responsibility. With a great teacher to student ratio, your child will receive plenty of individual care and attention.

THE PRIMARY YEARS





Learning about the world through inquiry

Learning is engaging in the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) as students learn through "Units of Inquiry", which brings different subjects together in a real world context. Students work collaboratively to discover languages, math, social studies, arts, sciences, physical, social and personal education, as well as IT, Thai, and music. Learning is transdisciplinary and linked to 6 organizing themes. This helps them to make connections, organize their knowledge, and understand the relevance of the concept and ideas they are learning.

Units are organized under the following transdisciplinary themes:

- · Who we are
- Where we are in place and time
- How we express ourselves
- · How the world works
- How we organize ourselves
- Sharing the planet

As with the other IB programmes, students in the PYP learn to see the bigger picture, allowing them to better appreciate how things work in the world. While gaining academic knowledge is one aspect of the programme, the PYP ensures that students develop their personal, social, and study skills, continuously reflecting and looking for opportunities for self-improvement, agency, leadership, and for taking action.



At the end of each of the IB Programmes the students will carry out an extended learning experience. In Grade 5, the last year of the PYP, students participate in "the PYP Exhibition". They research a real world issue of their choosing, such as discrimination or gender equality. Through the exhibition, students demonstrate their ability to take responsibility for their learning. Using all the skills learned in the PYP, they collect and analyze data, find ways to help and take action, and even design possible solutions to the issues. The exhibition

actively engages students in planning, presenting, and assessing their learning, exemplifying a powerful display of student agency.

The learning community participates in the exhibition, supporting and celebrating the development of internationally minded students who make a positive difference in their lives and the lives of others.











THE MIDDLE YEARS





Seeing the bigger picture

The Middle Years Programme (MYP) is a comprehensive programme of academic growth and life skills for 11 to 16 year-olds (Grade 6 - 10). The MYP is designed to foster students' independence, responsibility, and to develop internationally minded students who are creative, cooperative, and compassionate towards others. Assignments and activities are geared to cultivate a hands-on approach to learning with the aim of balancing intellectual challenge with the continued joy of learning.

Like the other IB programmes, the MYP encourages holistic learning, emphasizes understanding concepts, mastering skills, and developing attitudes, as well as learning knowledge. These are all tools designed to help students be successful in our global society, as well as providing a sound foundation for learning in the IB Diploma programme or IB Career-related programme.

Students are academically challenged in seven subjects: Language and Literature (English, Thai and other mother-tongue languages on request), Individuals and Societies, Mathematics, Physical and Health Education, a Second Language, Sciences, Arts, and Design.



In the MYP, subject learning is connected to real world scenarios through Global Contexts, which are:

- Identities and Relationships
- Personal and Cultural Identity
- Orientations in Space and Time
- Scientific and Technical Innovation
- Fairness and Development
- Globalization and Sustainability

This makes learning relevant and engaging, providing students a global perspective. Although the MYP subjects are taught separately, making connections between the subjects and the world around us remains an important element for deeper understanding.

To encourage this, units may be taught as interdisciplinary projects, involving two or more subject areas at a time. Students work individually and in groups, developing proficiency in team work and communication. Students are assessed on their academic knowledge, how they apply what they have learned, and on their skills.

In Grade 10, during their final year of the MYP, students create a "Personal Project". They can choose any appropriately challenging topic with the goal of creating or achieving something. Students learn to manage a large project from concept to creation, and write a detailed report about this process. Past examples include: composing a piece of music, creating a trash sorting robot, writing a science fiction novel, creating an artistic video game through Unity, creating a documentary, and building an electric guitar.

Not only does the MYP prepare students for a lifetime of learning, it also provides a solid basis for the graduation pathways offered.







THE IBDP



The IB Diploma programme

In their final two years at KIS, students can choose one of three pathways: the IB Diploma, the Career-related program, or a KIS Diploma with IB certificates.

The IB Diploma is a highly regarded diploma around the world. It allows students to delve deep into a broad range of academic subjects and also to develop other soft skills. Students will share that while it is a lot of hard work, it pays off in the end.

Students who complete the Diploma find that they are extremely well prepared for university life, not only based on their subject knowledge, but also with respect to life skills. Examples of attributes that students learn in the Diploma that help them at university include time management, organizational skills, independence, resilience, research and citation, leadership, collaboration, and critical thinking.

IB Diploma candidates select their subjects from each of the following 6 groups: Studies in Language and Literature, Language Acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, and the Arts (optional). Three subjects will be taken at Higher Level and three at Standard Level, allowing students to pursue advanced work in subjects of interest.



Three additional components, called "The DP Core", set the IB apart from other curricula. These core elements are: the Extended Essay, Creativity, Activity & Service (CAS), and Theory of Knowledge (TOK).





Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) emphasizes the importance of being an active part of society and Theory of Knowledge (TOK) is a philosophy course that develops critical thinking while getting students to think about what we know, and how we know it.





At the end of Grade 12, IB Diploma candidates complete oral and written exams which are prepared and graded externally by the IB, ensuring consistency of the IB Diploma candidates all around the world.

THE IBCP





The IB Career-related programme

Our newest pathway for students in Grades 11 and 12 is the Career-related programme (IBCP). The IBCP was developed in 2014 for students who have a known passion they want to pursue, gaining college credits and work experience while also gaining transferable skills like critical thinking, communication and cross-cultural engagement. This personalized dual enrollment, interdisciplinary approach allows students to take DP courses, University courses, and gain practical work experience, like internships.




The quality of education at KIS is high. Academic outcomes are well above world averages, guaranteeing that your child will receive an outstanding education.



A PASSION FOR SPORTS

Being active is an essential part of a balanced education and lifestyle



New research shows that participation in sports can increase academic achievement in children and adolescents*. It is with this, and a caring and inclusive community in mind, that KIS practices inclusivity on our sports teams.

This means that if you are interested in participating in our team sports at KIS, you are welcome to join. KIS has worked to build programs that safely allow as many children as possible to compete whether they are experienced or at a beginner level. We continually strive to create enough teams to allow all athletes committed to practices to have the opportunity to play. We utilize our facilities to ensure that all teams get the chance to participate in games and, when possible, tournaments at levels that match their abilities.

From U9 (Grade 2 - 3) to Varsity teams, students have the opportunity to develop their growing talents through a variety of sports that include swimming, football (soccer), volleyball, basketball, and badminton.

Throughout the year, our students compete against other international schools in Bangkok. Starting in U13 our teams can travel internationally as part of the through participation in the Mekong River International School Association (MRISA) to participating schools in Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, and around Thailand.

Students from Early Years up to Grade 10 have Physical Education classes twice a week and swimming is an essential part of the program. During PE class students become skilled at team and individual sports, while also learning the theory behind the sports and understanding the values of sportsmanship and teamwork.

The after school program has plenty of active options, such as jazz dance, taekwondo, football, badminton, ballet, swimming, hip hop, touch rugby, basketball, table tennis, gymnastics, yoga and more.

The sports facilities at school are outstanding, with indoor and outdoor courts, dance studios, a sports field and swimming pools.







LEARNING LANGUAGES

Multilingualism prepares students for a global community

KIS supports the IB's beliefs that continued development of mother tongue language is crucial for maintaining identity, cultural understanding, and empathy.

All students at KIS learn at least two languages. English is the language of instruction and additional support is offered for those who are not yet fluent in English through grade 9.







Other languages offered at KIS are Spanish, Mandarin, and Thai. Students are also able to learn any other language through the Other Languages Programme. Some examples of languages studied through the Other Languages Programme are: French, German, Hindi, Japanese, Bahasa, Serbian and Hebrew. Typically around 40% of students at KIS graduate with a Bilingual IB Diploma.









CLUBS

Discover your talents and passion

Clubs provide an opportunity for students to pursue their interests and develop passions, improve leadership skills, and get involved in service projects of interest. Clubs also foster a sense of community and belonging.

Our clubs are either school-led or student-driven. School-led clubs are typically organized and led by school staff, and may include activities such as sports teams, music groups, and academic clubs. Student driven clubs are initiated and led by students, and may include a wide range of interests and activities.

All of our clubs and activities are designed to provide a positive and engaging experience for students, and to foster a sense of community and belonging. We encourage all students to get involved and to take advantage of the many opportunities available to them, or to start a club aligned with their interests and passions.











EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

How we nurture curiosity, and experience our world outside the classroom

Learning in different environments is an exciting and powerful part of our educational approach, allowing students to actively engage with and learn from the world around them.

At KIS international school, we believe that hands-on, immersive experiences are an integral part of a well-rounded education. There is no better way to understand how our world is interconnected than to experience it first-hand.

Our field trips provide students with the opportunity to learn outside of the classroom and apply their knowledge in real-world settings.
