

Michele and the kitchen crew made a delightful beet hummus and some very well received beet and strawberry popsicles and the Farm to School Coordinator, Holly brought in refrigerator pickled beets for tasting. Moving forward, students will have the opportunity to help prepare food for the HOM taste test on a monthly basis.



### **Easy Refrigerator Pickled Beets**

### Ingredients:

- 6-8 medium beets (red, chioggia or gold)
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 1 1/2 cups apple cider vinegar, or white vinegar
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2-3 bay leaves, dry
- 1 tablespoon black peppercorns
- 1/2 tablespoon Kosher salt
- 1 tablespoon black peppercorns
- 1/2 tablespoon Kosher salt

### Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 400° F. Cut leaves and stems from beets and discard, or use for another purpose.
- Scrub and wash clean under water. Place a beet on a square of foil and drizzle with a bit of olive oil. Lightly sprinkle with salt and pepper, then tightly wrap in foil. Repeat for remaining beets.
- Place beets on a baking sheet. Bake 35-40 minutes, until tender. Cool slightly before removing foil.
- Scrub or peel off the skin and discard. Thinly slice beets and place stacked in small mason jars and set aside.
- 5. In a saucepan over medium-high heat, combine water, vinegar, sugar, bay leaf, peppercorns, and salt, plus additional desired spices or herbs. Bring to a boil then pour over beets until they are submerged.
- Tightly seal on lids and let cool slightly at room temp. Pace jars in the refrigerator for 4 to 7 days, then serve.

Please bring your child's birth certificate, proof of residency and up to date immunization.

All profits from this fundraiser will benefit our activity fund which helps to pay for enrichment activities for our CES students.



## Scrades K-12 Family Tips Help Kids Fight Cyberbullying and Other Mean Online Behavior



Most kids will encounter mean behavior at some point in their digital lives. For some kids, this experience is a blip that's easily forgotten, while for others it can have deep, long-lasting effects. For parents, the key is staying involved in kids' lives -- both online and off -- so they can step in and offer help if necessary. With guidance from parents and educators, kids can learn how to dodge the drama and stand up for others.

### Check out these 6 tips 2

### Define your terms.

Make sure kids understand what cyberbullying is: repeated and unwanted mean or hurtful words or behavior that occur online (through texts, social media posts, online chat, etc.).

### Check in about online life.


Just like you'd ask your kid about their sleep, exercise, and eating, stay on top of their online life. Who are they chatting with? How do people treat each other in the games and on the sites they're using?

### Role-play.

If kids feel like they might have trouble removing themselves from digital drama, experiment with some different ways they can make a graceful exit. Talk through words they can use, ways they can steer conversations in positive directions, etc.

### Encourage upstanding.

Let kids know that supporting a friend or acquaintance who is being bullied can make a big difference. If they feel safe confronting the bully, they should. If not, a private message to the victim can be enough to help someone through a tough time. Speaking up against hate speech is important, too.





### Take breaks.

If you notice your kid getting pulled into digital drama, help them take a break. It's great if they can determine for themselves when they need to step back, but they might need some help setting limits. Putting devices to bed at a specific time, plus breaks for mealtimes and face-to-face connection, can help kids recharge.



### Review worst-case steps.

Walk through what to do if your kid is being bullied online. First, step away. Ignoring a bully can be very effective. If the bullying continues, take screenshots or print out evidence. Then block the person. If it gets worse, report the behavior to a trusted adult. Talk about who those people are and make sure your kid has their contact information.

## **KEEPING CES HEALTHY**

- If your child is sick please keep them home.
- The CES "'sick kids stay home criteria" is:
- fever within the last 24 hours
- significant cold symptoms including a cough and runny nose
- Any kind of rash
- Antibiotics within the last 24 hours

- If your child has a mild residual cough, it is helpful to all if they wear a mask
- Masking is not required but we support anyone that chooses to wear one to protect themselves or others

If your child has Covid like symptoms, testing can prevent transmission to others

If they test positive, isolation for at least 5 days is required.

Notify the school. We are still required to report cases to the Department of Health

Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or positive test, whichever happens first

Isolation can end after day 5 if fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication and feeling better.

It is highly recommended to mask through day 10.

Please notify the school if your child has Covid-19.



#### Karate Kids (ages 5-10)

The Karate Kids Program is designed specifically for children ages 5 through 10. The emphasis is on gross motor skills and activities that are developmentally and age appropriate. Students engage in physical activities that work on balance, coordination, fitness, flexibility, speed, timing, and power skills, along with traditional martial arts movements.
