Maria applied for this grant through Archewell, a nonprofit organization created by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex Foundation (Prince Harry and Megan Markle) in partnership with VING, a national giving movement. Essays, videos and a follow-up reflection with the presentation video are all part of the application process. The recipient, who will remain anonymous, was not involved in the secretive application and was completely surprised with the presentation. VING and ARCHEWELL wish to empower young females with the idea of philanthropy.

Brett Phillips participated in the Pittsburgh Youth Philharmonic Orchestra for 8 years. This year, he won the Student Conductor Competition and made his conducting debut with the Philharmonic at the December concert. He will also conduct a piece at the spring concert.







Bristol Joseph is a 10-year-old student, who is a steward of the Earth and passionate about monarch butterfly conservation. After discovering that monarch butterflies were classified as an endangered species, Bristol set out to educate her community on ways to save the butterflies. She started Magical Milkweed Market, a business where she grows and sells milkweed plants. She encourages community members to take action in their yards to plant milkweed and create butterfly habitats.

Bristol is also a vocal advocate of monarch butterfly conservation and the planet, giving public speeches on the importance of planting milkweed and tending to the Earth. She runs a YouTube channel where she documents her travels to educate people about animals and the planet. She posts and edits videos about monarch butterflies, whale watching and her trips to locations with flourishing wildlife. Bristol's actions will benefit the planet and the monarch butterfly population for years to come.










Trout in the Classroom 2023


REQUIREMENTS:
