### A Note from Sister Rayleen:

Last week, Br. Alan, six students, and I had the blessed opportunity to attend the Mass of Reception to welcome Bishop Richard G. Henning as coadjutor bishop of Providence. The cathedral's capacity seemed to be enlarged by the attendees with their joyous excitement. Students and adults from throughout the diocese, as well as guests from visiting dioceses, were captivated by the sights and sounds upon entering the cathedral. Although the felt sense of joy of those gathered reached a pinnacle when Bishop Henning walked around the cathedral with his letter from Pope Francis, there seemed to be a strong sentiment of hope following Bishop Henning's homily. Our new bishop, ironically, spoke of the virtue of hope. Among his reflections, he shared an image from a poem by Charles Peguy. In his poem, Mr. Peguy describes Hope as the youngest of three sisters. Her two sisters, Faith and Love, are walking hand-in-hand with her. Bishop Henning reflected that Hope, the youngest of the three, holds Faith and Love together and keeps them young. Moving beyond the image of the sisters holding hands, our new bishop encouraged us to consider how the virtue of hope shares additional traits with children. For example, hope draws us out of our concerns; it reminds us of wonder; helps us to see what is possible; and sees the goodness in life.

Since last Thursday, I have found myself going back to Bishop Henning's reflection. Undoubtedly, each one of us appreciates the need, and perhaps desire, to have a little hope in our lives. Although I have come to understand all three virtues to be gifts of God and have attempted to find ways to nourish them, I fully resonated with Bishop Henning's final assertion (and I think he would say St. Paul's assertion) that the virtue of hope is nourished by those who accompany us. I do believe hope thrives when we surround ourselves with those who dare to hope. I have asked myself more than once since the Mass of Reception: How am I nourishing hope in those I accompany, especially our students? How can I better nourish hope in all? My prayer is that I become more hope-full so I may foster hope in others.

May God continue to bless us with Hope as we walk hand-in-hand with our children. May we allow them to draw us out of our concerns, remind us to wonder, help us to see what is possible, and recognize the goodness in life.
