

## **Community Council Minutes** **Thursday, January 19, 2023**

### **Review and Approve December Minutes**

- One change to November's minutes as given – the title of the review section inadvertently identified the minutes we were approving at the December meeting as “September” instead of “November”
- The council reviewed to approve December's minutes with the above change
  - Rachel motioned to approve, Emily seconded, unanimously approved.

### **Employment Disclosure by Julianne**

- Julianne has been hired to be a TA at the school.
  - As she doesn't have a teaching license there shouldn't be a conflict of interest
  - She would recuse herself from any vote that directly impacts her position
  - Principal Naylor checked with the state, and they are comfortable with her still being a community designated member

### **Safety/Digital Citizenship Plan**

- Julianne - Present draft flyer and video script to be sent home to parents.
  - Julianne read through the draft and the CC discussed and provided feedback
  - The plan is for every teacher to review it with their class, and then send the form home to review with their parents
    - Kids bring the form back to teachers for a prize
      - We need to discuss the funding of the prizes as CC doesn't have any
        - Julie suggested potentially combining with PTA's white ribbon week and using funds from the PTA - Julie is checking on this
  - We additionally discussed ideas to incentivize the students
    - Pizza party or pie with the principal
    - Principal Naylor is going to check on if there are bracelets left
  - Can we use the Hope Squad or student council to create the video
    - It is generally better to come from the kids instead of adults

### **Current Legislation Regarding Public Education**

- Principal Naylor briefed on the significant legislation about public education currently being debated
  - Vouchers
    - 89-90% are satisfied with their school
    - Vouchers take public money and they can use that to go to a private school
    - They are talking about allowing these vouchers to go to homeschool programs as well
  - \$6,000 raise for teacher, but it's tied to the voucher system
    - The Utah PTA sent an email asking for "no" votes on this
    - The \$6,000 sounds good, but \$4,200 of this is already dictated annually by the legislature
