

High School Specialized Programs & Support Services



SPECIAL EDUCATION

The Special Education programs and services outlined in this flyer are available to all high school students who meet the eligibility criteria under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and reside within the Long Beach Unified School District (LBUSD) attendance boundary.

Resource Specialist Programs

The Resource Specialist Program (RSP) serves students whose primary placement is in the general education classroom at his/her residence school. Students may receive specialized academic instruction (SAI) from the Resource Specialist within the general education English Language Arts (ELA) or Math classes. Additional content intervention classes (Core Content Support-CCS) may also be offered as an elective on some high school campuses. Please contact the school site for more information on these classes.

Special Day Class (SDC) Services

A student who requires specialized instruction to access core content may attend special day classes. These specialized classes are designed to meet the specific needs of students with Mild/Moderate (M/M) and Moderate/Severe (M/S) disabilities, as well as students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing (D/HH), have emotional disabilities (ED) or have Specialized Health Care (SpHC) needs. Students in SDC classrooms may earn a high school diploma or a certificate of completion, depending on the student's IEP. Please see or consult your high school counselor for specific course and graduation requirements.

Transportation Services

If the IEP team determines that home-to-school transportation is needed in order for the child to access his/her education, transportation will be provided. However, please know that *transportation services are NOT offered to a student placed through the School of Choice (SOC) process. If placed through SOC, transportation services will not be provided for the duration of the high school program.*

Autism Specific Programs

There is a continuum of services for students on the autism spectrum. Many students are supported in the general education class with/without behavioral support services. Others may participate in a Special Day Class (SDC). LBUSD does not offer Autism specific special day classes at the high school level.
