School

El Camino High School at Ventura College (ECHS) is

- a **public independent study/early college high school** situated on a small, peaceful campus on the grounds of Ventura College.
- Students are offered an **individualized** four-year high school curriculum for grades 9 through 12 that is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.
- Our program is **competency-based**, meaning all courses and tests must be passed with scores at 70% or better. College preparatory and select honors and Advanced Placement courses meet the a-g requirements for admission to the University of California or California State University.
- ECHS students have the option of participating in **competitive sports** through the programs at their boundary high schools within Ventura Unified School District.
- **Each semester, students are required to be dually enrolled at one of the three Ventura County Community Colleges for enrichment, career exploration, and advanced study.**

Students request enrollment at ECHS through the Ventura Unified School District Alternate Placement Committee. Criteria for acceptance into the program include strong reading and math skills as well as other academic and personal factors.

In 2010 ECHS was selected as a Model Independent High School by the California Department of Education, and in 2013 was designated as a California Distinguished School. In 2019 and 2020 respectively, ECHS was recognized as an outstanding Gold and Silver Medal School for our schoolwide implementation of Academic Innovations' Career Choices program.



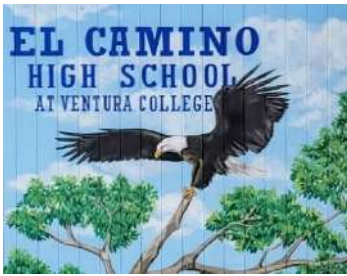
Mission

At El Camino High School at Ventura College, we provide students with a supportive and caring academic environment, rich in opportunity, choice, accountability, and challenge. We believe each student is entitled to a learning environment and delivery system that best suits their academic abilities, personal needs, and goals. We will **inspire** all students to excel academically, **honor** the unique qualities and diverse background of all students, **build** supportive relationships, **guide** all students to reach their full potential, **motivate** all students to successfully pursue their chosen life paths, and **engage** all students to become responsible and contributing members of society.

Community

The city of San Buenaventura (Ventura) is a beach community approximately 65 miles northwest of Los Angeles and 30 miles south of Santa Barbara. It is home to approximately 110,000 and attracts many to its friendly community life with easy access to surfing, hiking and other outdoor activities. The city's largest employers are in the health care, county services, retail, and education industries. The 2020 US Census Bureau reports the ethnicities represented as: 81.2% White; 36.9% Hispanic; 4.1% Asian Alone; 7.5% Two or more races; 1.7% Black or African American; 1.1% Native American; and 0% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander.

In Ventura Unified School District, there are two comprehensive high schools, one technology magnet high school, one independent study high school, one continuation high school, and an adult education program.



Covid-19 Impact Statement

Distance learning for all Ventura Unified School District (VUSD) schools began on March 16th of the 2019-20 school year and continued through June 2020. Second semester course marks for the 2019-20 school year were traditional letter grades, but Pass/No Pass/No Marks were also allowed and issued.

VUSD continued with distance learning for the 2020-21 school year conforming to the state's mandate regarding minimum amounts of daily live/synchronous instruction via synchronous videoconferencing classes and asynchronous work in Canvas. All VUSD schools began offering optional in-person instruction in April 2021 with synchronous concurrent/Zoom teaching for students choosing to remain at home. All course marks for the 2020-21 school year were traditional letter grades and Pass/No Pass marks at the student/parent/guardian's request per the mandate issued in California Assembly Bill 104. VUSD schools returned to full-time in-person instruction at the start of the 2021-22 school year.

Curriculum

El Camino utilizes an independent study delivery system for core classes taken on our campus. Flexible learning arrangements allow students to pursue their goals or outside responsibilities while staying on track for graduation. This includes creating four-year learning plans individualized according to students' post-secondary objectives such as completing requirements for career-technical training, UC-CSU college entrance, university STEM prerequisites, or Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC-see page 4).

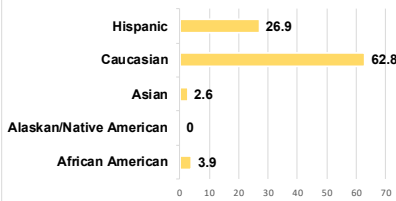
- Earn community college credits that can also be applied to high school graduation requirements

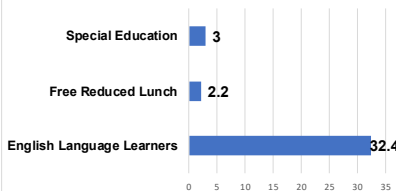

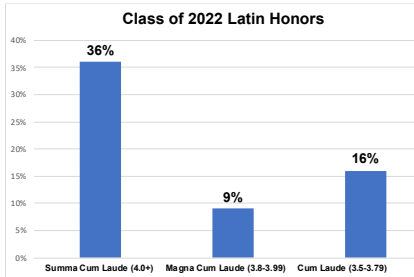

ECHS does not rank students. Latin honors are used to recognize and distinguish high academic performance.

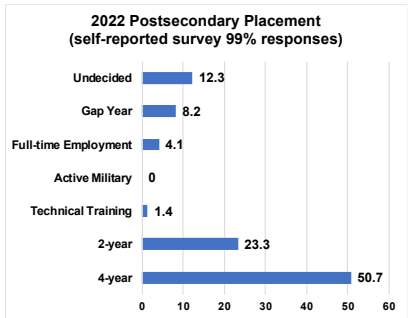


AP Scores (August 2022)

ECHS & Ventura College Credits

ECHS' and VC's calendars are on a semester system. At El Camino, students earn five credits per course each semester. Completion of year-long courses earns ten high school credits.

For community college courses, a semester three- to five-unit course is equivalent to ten high school credits. College courses awarding less than three units earn five high school credits.

GPA is calculated on a 4.0 scale. Weighted GPA is on a 5.0 scale. AP courses and Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) are weighted one extra point. (See page 3 for IGETC courses available to our students at Ventura College.)

Postsecondary Skills Development

ECHS students participate in career exploration and 21st-century skills development via specialty classes and clubs:

- **Clubs** such as **Fashion & Design, Gardening, GeoChallenge, Journalism, and Political Discourse** provide spaces for exploring interests, building camaraderie, and growing self-confidence.



El Camino students pursue multiple **Ventura County Community College Career Education** pathways such as Automotive, Agriculture, Business, Child Development, Criminal Justice, Dental Hygiene, Fire Science, and Welding programs. Each semester our Juniors and Seniors are invited to enroll in career mentorships via Ventura County Office of Education's **Career Education Center** in partnerships with community organizations. Three students each semester participate in Naval Surface Warfare Center, Port Hueneme Division's **Pre-Engineering Program**.
