Our school's outdoor space serves many purposes – a place to play, learn, gather, and celebrate. Over 25 years old and showing its age, our playground needs some love and attention. And, we know that our schoolyard can be so much more than what currently exists.

For the past year, Jefferson Elementary has been partnering with Trust for Public Land (TPL) to imagine the future possibilities of the schoolyard. At this time, our focus is on the front playground, but we are exploring ways to improve the entire schoolyard.


# **YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED**

### WHAT WILL THE NEW SCHOOLYARD LOOK LIKE?

Simple answer is that we don't full know yet!

Currently, we have a concept - or basic idea - of what we want the schoolyard to look like. Over the next few months, we'll continue to refine these plans. There is still plenty of time for you to help shape this project.

On the next board, we highlight the early concept plan. Know that this plan is not finalized! It is just one early idea of what the schoolyard could look like. The actual project design will depend on community feedback, budget, and site logistics.



## WHAT IDEAS HAVE BEEN SHARED SO FAR?

Students, parents, and teachers have shared great ideas for the playground. The general theme of feedback include:

- Play: space needs new play equipment
- Shade: more trees and shade for when it's hot
- Accessibility: ensure everyone can use the space, including those with different abilities
- A place to sit: everyone, from kids to grandparents, needs a break at some point
- Outdoor learning: a new space so class can be taken outdoors
- Soccer: the community would like a place to play soccer
- Habitat: the schoolyard could be a place for plants and animals
- Art: new pops of color would add vibrancy to the schoolyard

### WHEN WILL THIS WORK TAKE PLACE?

The reimagining of the front schoolyard space will take place in three distinct projects.

<u>Project 1 - Site circulation and parking</u> Status: Complete



<u>Project 2 - Nature-centered improvements to eastern</u> <u>third of front playground</u> Status: In planning. Construction Summer 2023

<u>Project 3 - Replacement of playground equipment</u> <u>adjacent to school building</u> Status: Dependent on success fundraising

## WHAT ABOUT IMPROVEMENTS TO THE BACK PLAYGROUND?

Currently, we are focusing efforts on the older, front playground. If funding becomes available, it is possible some improvements may occur in the back playground.


