

Raising Confident, Competent Children is a Triple P seminar that helps lower the stress of parenting by equipping parents to:

- Encourage confidence in their children
- Help their children reach their own potential
- Enable their children to get along well with others

Triple P is a research-based, internationallyrecognized, multilevel parent support program funded by Licking Memorial Health Systems and supported by Mental Health and Recovery of Licking and Knox Counties and Our Futures in Licking County.

96 percent of parents who have tried some of the Triple P strategies have seen an improvement in their child's behavior!









Northridge Athletic Boosters

Athletic Hall of Fame Selection Criteria

The intention of the Northridge Athletic Hall of Fame is to foster tradition, pride, and excellence through proper recognition of those individuals who have made exemplary contributions to the success of the Northridge athletic program and have distinguished themselves by bringing honor to themselves and to the Northridge community.

Three Areas of Recognition The Hall of Fame is designed to recognize former athletes, former coaches, as well as individuals who have made exceptional contributions to the athletic program at Northridge High School and who have brought honor to the school through their athletic achievements.

Membership Criteria Athletes – Must be at least five years out of high school; must have participated in a sport at Northridge for at least one season. Coaches must have coached at Northridge for at least one season. Distinguished Service – No specific requirements.

The Committee The Nominating Committee is made up of Northridge High School Alumni, The Booster President and The Athletic Director. The committee members should span the decades. The panel should be made up of 4-6 people and if at all possible members should reside in the district. The committee will be over seen by the Athletic Booster President and should include a secretary to take minutes of committee meetings.

Nomination Process Nominations can be made by anyone. Nominees from the previous year will be automatically considered. Nominations must include: relevant information regarding the nominee including any conference, district, state or national honors or awards and any athletic achievements and honors since graduation.

Voting Process Members shall be inducted by a vote of the Committee by a ¾ majority vote. In the event of a tie, the Athletic Booster President shall make the final determination. Voting will be a secret ballot.

Recognition The inductee will receive a plaque and a plaque will be placed in designated hall of fame area in the school. The inductee will receive a lifetime pass for two, to all home Northridge sporting events.
